

Dr. Linda Mason is Professor of Food Pest Management in the Center for Urban and Industrial Pest Management in the College of Agriculture at Purdue University. She teaches Insect Behavior and Insect Ecology to graduate and undergraduate students as well as training graduate students in urban pest management. Her research focus is on the development of environmentally friendly management programs to prevent insect, rodent and vertebrate contamination of food during production and storage in the post harvest, retail and consumer markets. Her success in outreach is demonstrated by the widespread acceptance of her programs throughout the United States and overseas averaging 30-40 presentations annually. She is a consultant for many of the largest food producers and retailers and also serves as an expert witness on cases involving food contamination. Her entomological peers recognized her accomplishments by electing her to serve as an officer on the Entomological Society of America Governing Board and Secretary-Treasurer of the society. She is a member of the Advance Purdue Leadership Team and the Advance Representation to the College of Agriculture.
