

Language courses in the sequence 101-402 are taught in the target language. All four skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing) are developed, though different levels may give special emphasis to one or two of these skills.

- If a student needs to repeat one of the courses in the sequence, s/he should do so before going on to the next level. It is not appropriate, for example, to allow a student who has completed FL 301 to go back to “clean up” a grade in 101-202.
- Native speakers may not take courses in the 101-402 sequence, nor 424 (“Business Language,” since the latter is also a language skills course, not a ***business*** course).
- The one-credit conversation courses (111, 112, 211, 212) are ***elementary*** conversation courses. Therefore, students who are in courses numbered 301 or higher should not be taking them. Besides, advanced conversation is an important component of courses numbered 301-402.
- In French, German, Spanish, 300-, 400-, and 500-level courses are taught in the target language. Successful completion of 302 should indicate that the student is ready for 400-level courses, both in language skills and in content areas.
- In some of the other languages, 300- and 400-level courses (other than 301-402) may be taught in English.
- All 330 courses (Cinema) are taught in English.
