RECRUITING

Institution Utilizing Student Groups During a Prospect's Official and Unofficial Visits:

An institution may not provide free meals at a restaurant facility or entertainment to those members of an institutional student support group that accompany a prospect during the official visit unless the student is designated as the student host and thereby eligible to receive the permissible entertainment allowance to entertain a prospect during the prospect's official visit. [10/14/98 Staff].

Publicity:

Purdue University cannot publicize a prospect's visit to campus (NCAA Bylaw 13.11). If you are asked a question about a prospect, you should refer all questions from the media to the coaches.

Entertainment:

An institution may entertain a prospect and his/her parents at a scale comparable to that of normal student life, only on the institution's campus (or if on an official visit within 30 miles of the campus). Entertainment and contact by representatives of the institution's athletics interests during the official visit is prohibited. An institution may not arrange or permit excessive entertainment of a prospect on the campus or elsewhere (e.g., hiring a band for a dance specifically for the entertainment of the prospect, a chauffeured limousine, a helicopter.)

Complimentary Admissions:

During a campus athletic event, prospects on official and unofficial visits may receive complimentary admissions. Such admissions may provide seating only in the general seating area of the facility. Providing seating during the conduct of the event (including intermission) in the facility's press box, special seating box, or bench area is specifically prohibited.

Employment of Prospective Student-Athletes at Institutional Athletics Events/Facility:

An institution's athletics department may not employ any group consisting of prospects (e.g., athletics team, high-school athletics booster group, non-athletics high-school group), except as provided in Bylaw 13.2.4.1. However, it is permissible for a department of the institution (other than the athletics department) or an independent, third-party entity (e.g., an entity to which the athletics department has contracted out the responsibility of hiring groups to work for the institution) to employ a group of prospects to work at the institution's athletics contests or non-athletics events taking place in athletics facilities, provided:

- (a) the opportunity for employment is available to other groups in general;
 - (b) the group is not selected for a recruiting purpose; and (3) the athletics department has no involvement in the selection process.
