Highlights of Student Success Characteristics

West Lafayette Enrollment and Diversity

- West Lafayette total enrollment is 39,256 (30,147 undergraduates, 946 professional and 8,163 graduate students).
- Undergraduate residency mix: 58% Resident, 26% U.S. Nonresidents and 16% International.
- The percent of undergraduate women is 43%.
- Minority undergraduate population (Hispanic/Latino, Black/African American, Asian, American Indian/Native Alaskan, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and Two or More Races) is 4,140. Minority professional/graduate population is 1,076. The combined minority enrollment of 5,216 is a record high for Purdue.
- International undergraduate population of 4,974 is also a record.

Academic Preparation of New Freshmen and Admission

- Overall, the freshman academic profile is the highest ever for Purdue.
- SAT Total average for 2012 is 1749 which is an 18-point one-year increase. The ACT average improved to 26.9.
- The mean high school GPA rose from 3.62 to 3.66 and High School class rank rose from 83 to 84.
- There was a record high of 30,903 freshman applications submitted for the West Lafayette campus.
- Sixty-one percent (61%) of freshman applicants were admitted compared to 72% in 2008. The yield of admitted students increased to 33.2%, the highest in five years.

Graduation and Retention

- First to second year retention rates increased by a 0.4 percentage point difference compared to last year (90.2% to 90.6%). Second to third year retention increased from 82.5% to 83.7%. Both retention rates are Purdue records.
- The four-year graduation rate increased by 3.3 percentage points (42.4% to 45.7%) compared to last year.
- The six-year graduation rate increased by 1.5 percentage points (68.7% to 70.2%) compared to last year.

Highlights of Student Success Programs

- Boiler Gold Rush (BGR) had 5,043 new students (freshmen and transfers) participating. This included nearly 76% of the new beginner population. BGR participants consistently have significantly higher retention rates than non-participants – 91% v 89% for fall 2011. This is especially true for participating women and underrepresented minorities (women 91% v 90%; URM 90% v 83%).
- This fall, 82 Learning Communities have a total participation of 1,863 students.
- The 2012-13 academic year marks the fourth year of Purdue Promise, a program that combines financial support with intentional and strategic support services to assist eligible 21st Century Scholars, Purdue Opportunity Award Scholars, and Emerging Urban Leaders in their transition and success at Purdue. The ultimate goal is to retain and graduate these students – many of which are low-income, first-generation, and/or underrepresented minorities – at rates higher than the all-undergraduate average at Purdue. The program currently serves 892 students in four cohorts, the first of which will graduate at the end of this year.
- Within the College of Technology, the Windows of Opportunity for Women in Technology (WOW-iT) is targeting the high school female students involved in a Project Lead the Way course. A Project Lead the Way course is a pre-engineering/engineering technology course for high school students to help introduce the discipline of engineering and engineering technology. The WOW-iT one day program held last November had 40 students participate.
- The Math Department in the College of Science is running a GAANN (Graduate Assistantships in Areas of National Need) Program intended to recruit women and other minorities into the Ph.D. program. With assistance from the Graduate School, the department has been able to award three-year fellowships to two domestic women, two Latino men, and one African American man, and obtain a Purdue Dissertation Fellowship for a new African American woman who will start the Ph.D. program in the fall of 2013.
- The Leadership Communication Center (LCC) in the Krannert School of Management facilitates communication skill development for management undergraduate students. This mission is accomplished by one-on-one or team training on development of presentations, personal coaching for improvement of communication skills, videotaping for self-reflection, providing specialized workstations and software for presentation development.
- The College of Education's *Science Teaching Service Learning* course offers service learning experiences to provide students interested in STEM education with an opportunity to learn about science teaching and learning while providing service to a community organization. During the spring semester 2012, the course service learning project was to design and run a science club ("Rambler Science Club") at St. Lawrence Elementary School in Lafayette, Indiana. A total of 93 St. Lawrence students (almost 50% of student population) participated in the science club. As a result of the course, three out of the four Purdue students applied for and were offered a Purdue Noyce Scholarship to pursue science teaching certification.
- The Leadership Development Certificate Program provides the College of Agriculture students with experience and growth in leadership. Each student, with the guidance and assistance of a leadership coach, develops his or her own leadership learning experience that meets the program's specific requirements. In 2011-2012, approximately 250 students and 70 faculty and staff coaches participated in the program.
- Students at Purdue's regional campuses participate in a variety of activities that both enhance their education and contribute to the community (e.g. Cooperative Education at IPFW; Nursing program capstone at Calumet; Economic Development Workshops at PNC).

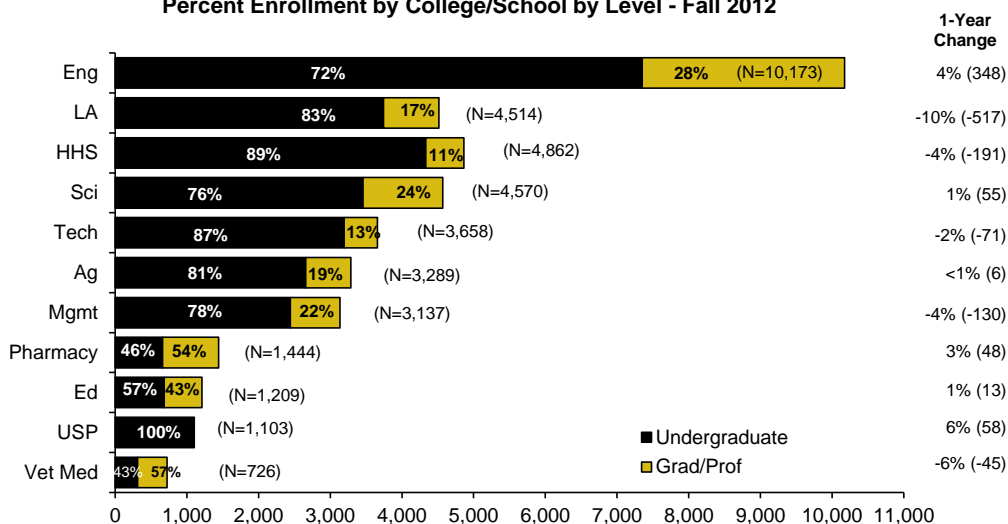

- Total enrollment is 381 fewer than last year with the entire decrease in undergraduate enrollment (-629). Both graduate students (+226) and professional students (+22) increased. Enrollment goals were met.
- The number of international students continues to rise, 9.5% higher among undergraduates than last year and 5.8% higher among graduate/professional students. Purdue is one of the leading U.S. public institutions enrolling students from all over the world.
- Among U.S. citizens and Permanent Residents, the number of ethnic minorities increased by 22 and the number of underrepresented minorities by 68. Women comprise 42% of total enrollment, unchanged from last year.

Fall Semester Enrollment for All Students by College/School

- Engineering is the largest college on the West Lafayette campus with an enrollment of 10,173.
- There are a total of 946 professional students, 644 in Pharmacy and 302 in Veterinary Medicine.
- 202 undergraduates are nondegree. At the graduate level, 369 students are in interdisciplinary and special programs.

Percent Enrollment by College/School by Level - Fall 2012

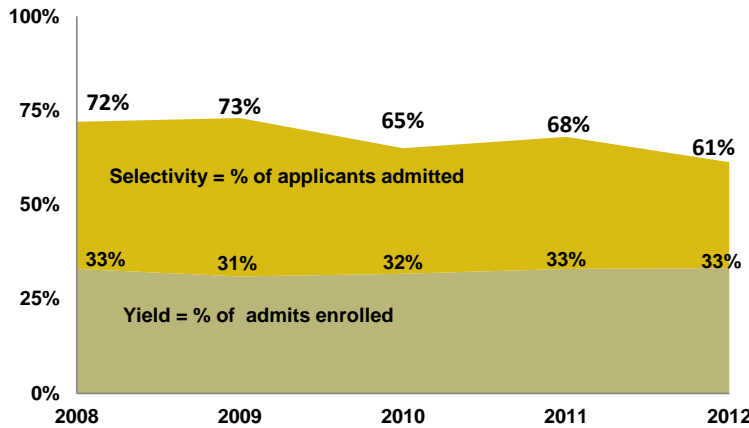

Admissions Freshmen Beginners



- A record 30,903 applications were received for the 2012 freshman class.
- Yield of admitted students rose slightly from 2011 to 33.2%.
- **Indiana Applicants** - Over 9,000 Indiana residents applied; among those who completed their applications, all but 502 were offered admission to the Purdue system. Among the 5,878 who were offered admission to the West Lafayette campus, 58.4% enrolled, an increase of 1.1 percentage points.

- By design, the 2012 new entry class is 5.5% smaller than last year at 6,291 students. Plans are to maintain this level of freshman class to further improve retention rates and to better match the instructional and physical capacity of the West Lafayette campus.
- Representing 16.1% of the U.S. freshmen, there are 849 minority students. Underrepresented minority students comprise 9.6% of the new class.
- Women compose 44.5% of the entering class, the highest percentage in six years.

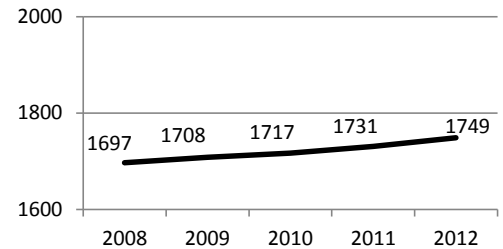

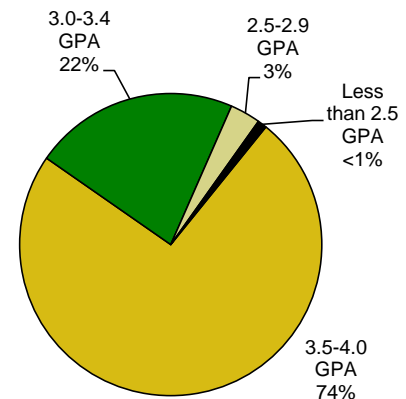

- The average high school GPA of entering freshmen was 3.66, an increase of .04 from last year.
- Seventy-four percent of our freshmen had a GPA of 3.5 or higher, an increase of 5 percentage points over last year.
- Among those whose schools submitted a class rank, 41% (compared to 39% last year) were in the top 10% of their class. The number of schools reporting rank remained at only 52% this year.

Advanced Placement Scores

• The rigor of the high school curriculum is an excellent predictor of success in college. The Advanced Placement curriculum is the most widespread rigorous curriculum with national benchmarks.

• The number and percentage of Purdue freshmen with at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher has increased to 44.5% of the class, compared to 38% last year.

• This compares to 18.1% of high school graduates nation-wide and 14.0% of Indiana high school graduates scoring a 3 or higher on at least one exam in 2010.

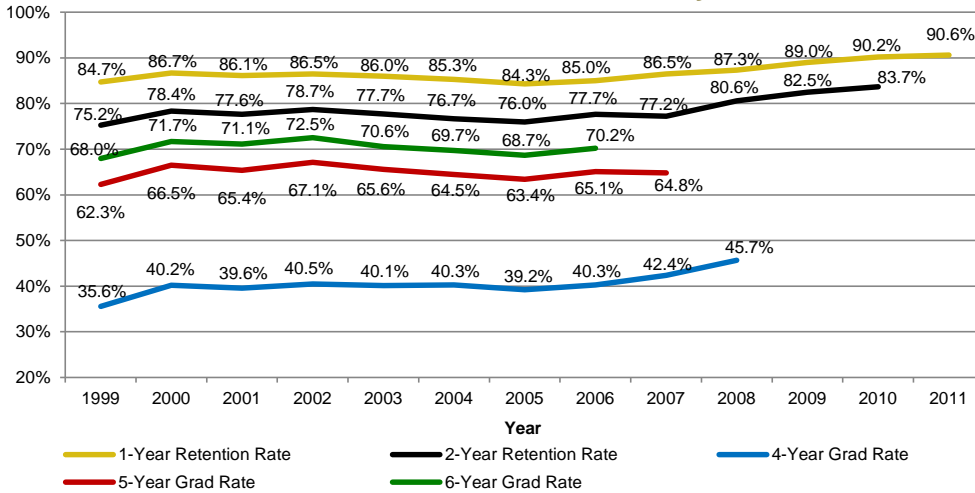

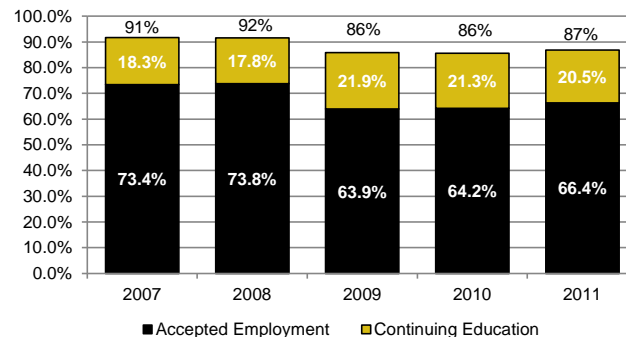

- Purdue's one-year retention rate steadily increased the last several years and is now a record high of 90.6%. Two-year retention was also a record at 83.7%.
- Women continued to be retained at a higher rate than male students. International students continue to have the highest retention rates of all residencies.
- The historical gaps among the retention of most ethnic groups has narrowed in recent years, and for the fall 2011 cohort the Hispanic/Latino retention rate of 90.7% is higher than the University's overall retention.
- The four-year graduation rate of 45.7% is a Purdue record and on trajectory toward a goal of a 50% four-year rate. As expected, for the first time in three years the six-year graduation rate increased to higher than 70%. As the better-retained cohorts move through Purdue, the six-year graduation rate will improve.
- The three-year average of the six-year graduation rate of 70% for Purdue remains behind the Peer and Big Ten public university means.

- Four-, five-, and six-year graduation rates only take into consideration students who begin in the fall or summer as full-time freshman beginners.

- To take into account transfer students and those who begin in the spring and summer, an illustrative measure of degree production is the number of annual Bachelor's degrees conferred relative to annualized enrollment.

- As a member of the National Student Clearinghouse, Purdue has access to information regarding the attainment of degrees elsewhere by students who began at one of our campuses.

- Approximately 70% of the 2003, 2004 and 2005 entering freshman classes graduated from the West Lafayette campus. But another 7.9% from the 2003 cohort, 8.1% from the 2004 cohort, and 7.5% from the 2005 cohort graduated from U.S. institutions that participate in the Clearinghouse.

- IUPUI graduated the largest number of these students for the three years. Several other Indiana institutions and those in nearby states graduate former WL students most frequently. The remaining degrees, however, were earned from a highly differentiated set of institutions across the country.

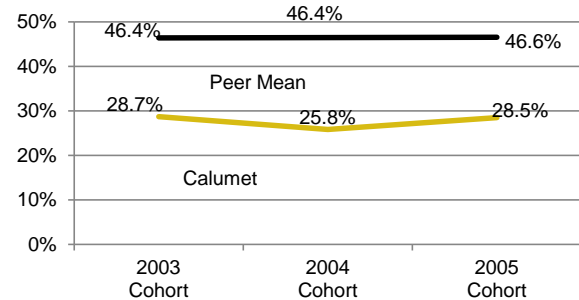

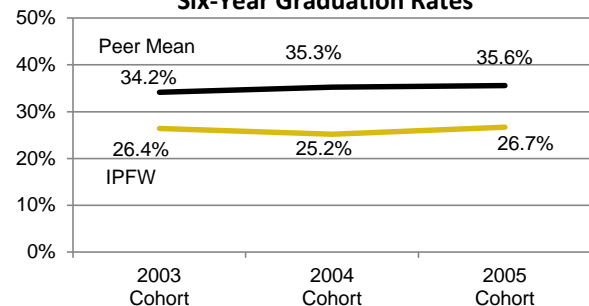

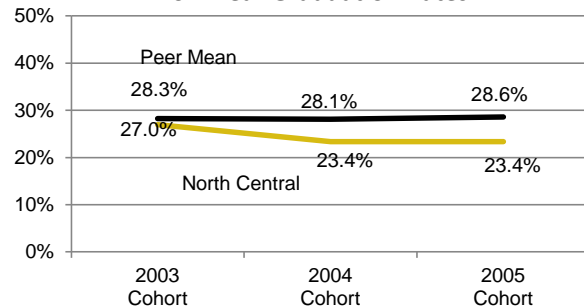
