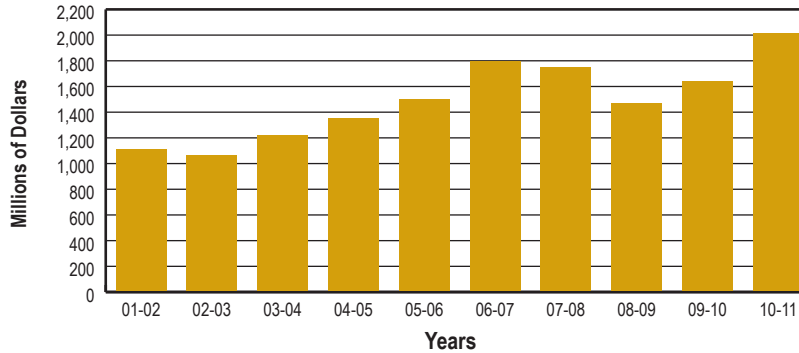

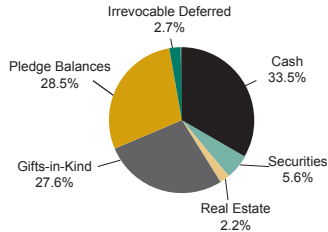

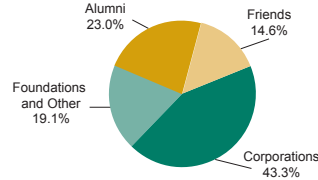

Net Production Distribution by Type for Fiscal Year 2010-11 to June 30



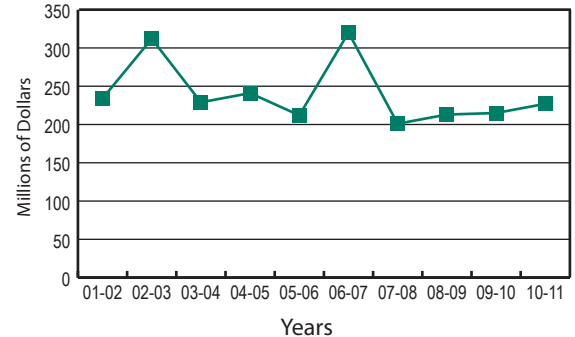

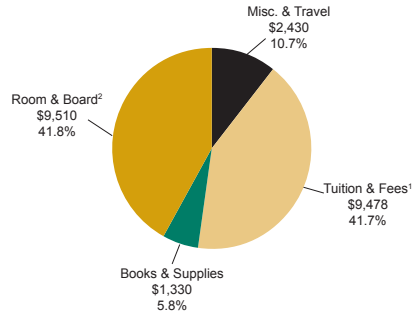

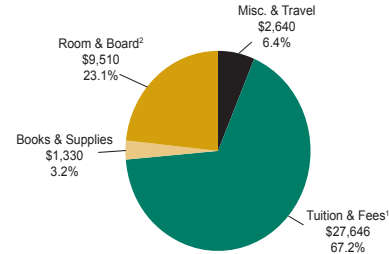

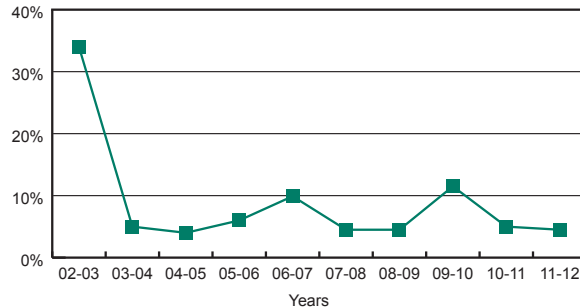

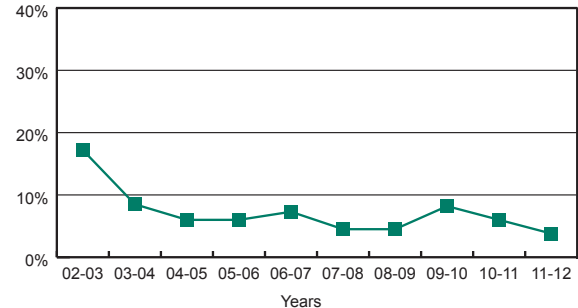

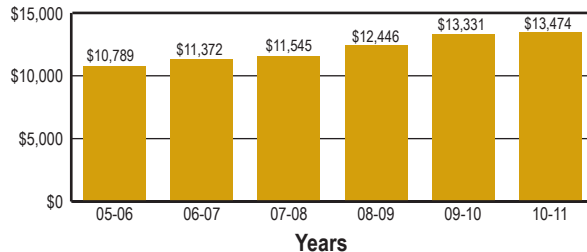

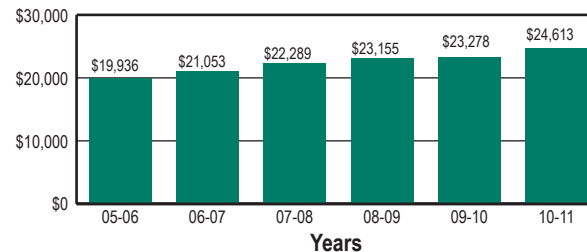

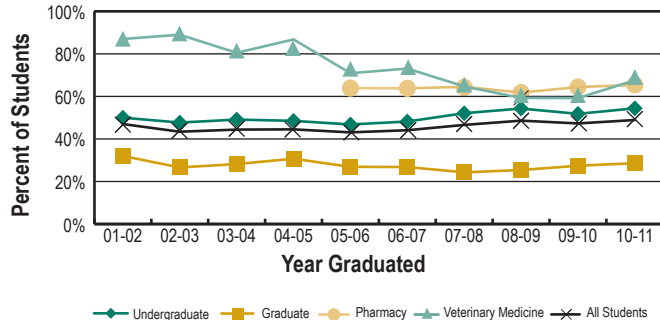

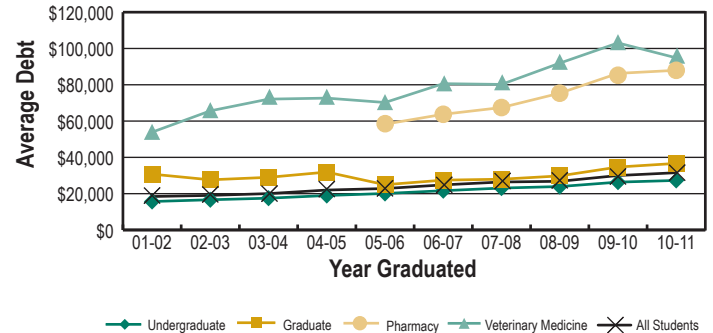
