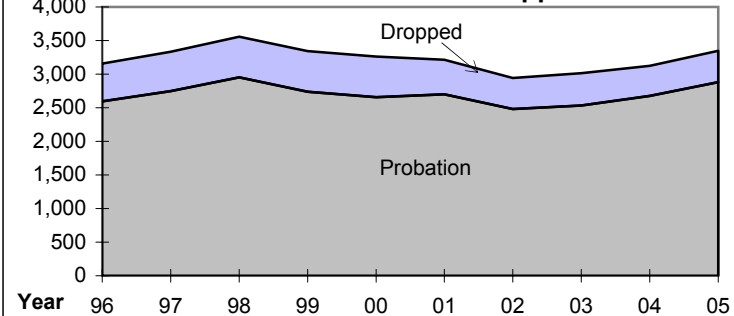

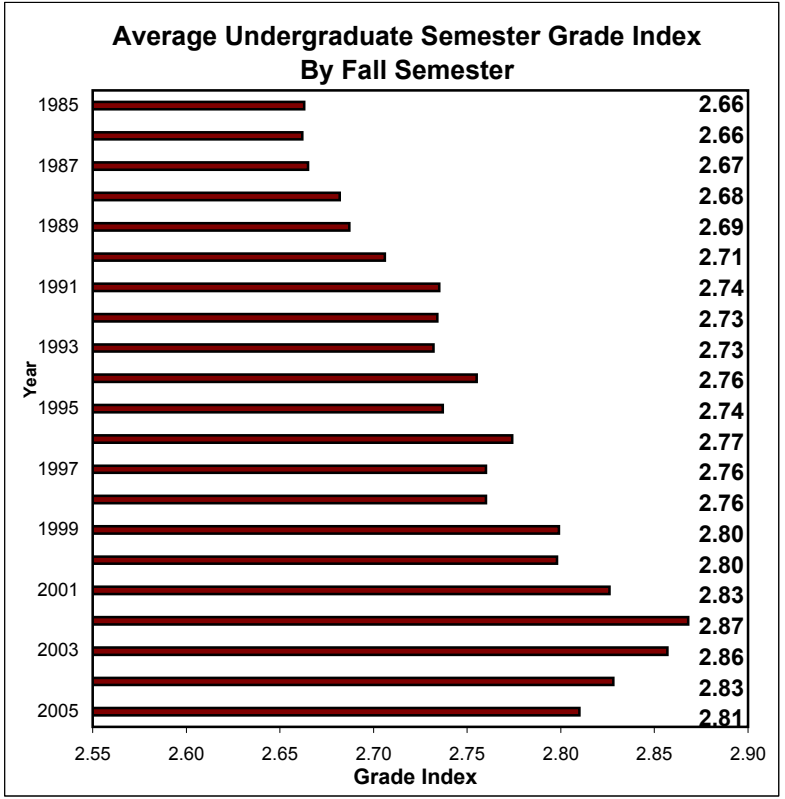
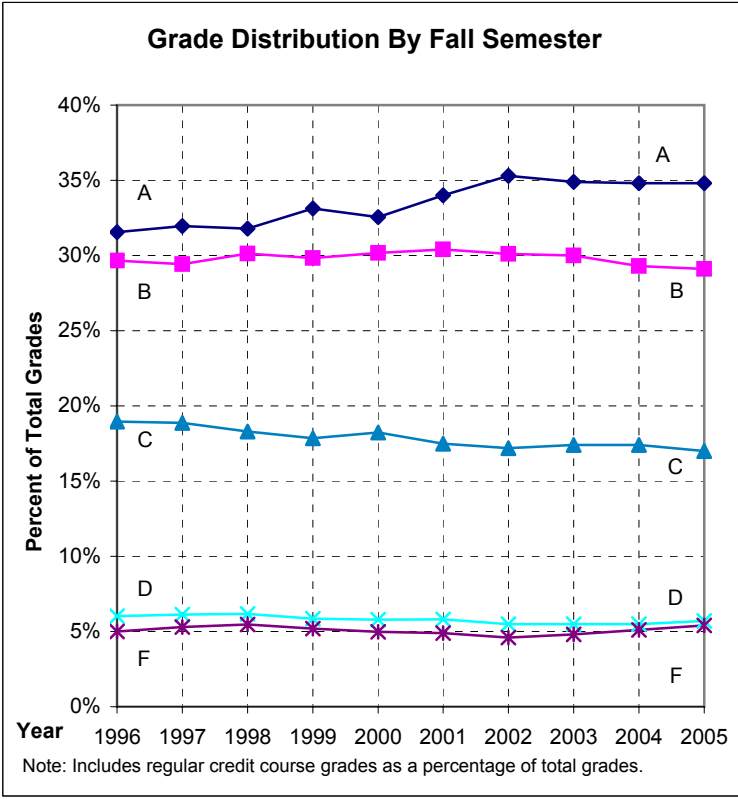
Historical Semester Honors, Dean's List and Both

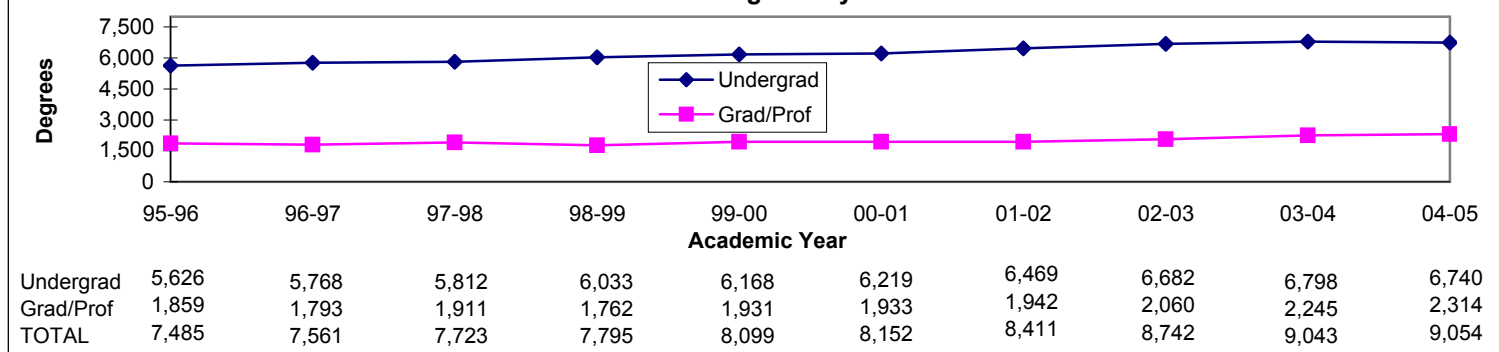
