- Purdue Graduate Student Government Bill of Rights and Responsibilities Resolution: Be it resolved that The Purdue University Senate endorses the Graduate Student Bill of Rights and Responsibilities as passed by the Purdue Graduate Student Government.
- Course Retake Policy Amendment: Replace the current wording with the proposed wording: "All students should shall be allowed to enroll in a nonrepeatable course at most three times."
