Your academic status at Purdue is important to us, and we are concerned about any student on academic probation being able to remain in school. We are aware that there are many reasons why students have academic problems. This probation period may be a good time for you to honestly determine the reasons for your difficulties and to devise a plan to raise your graduation index. What is academic probation?

Academic probation is a warning that your grades are low and you are in danger of being dropped from the University. You were placed on probation because either your semester (term) or graduation (cumulative) index fell below the level identified in Table A. Check your semester classification (Class) to see what the probation level is for you. If you don't know your classification (Class), check with your academic advisor, the Office of the Registrar, or go to mypurdue.purdue.edu and click on the Academic tab.

What graduation index do I need to avoid being dropped?

Once again, use your semester classification (Class) on Table B to determine the graduation (cumulative) index you will need to stay in school.

Is there any other requirement?

Yes, you will be dropped if you earn failing (F) grades in six credit hours or more for the semester, regardless of your graduation (cumulative) index.
