2020 Letter of Recommendation Service

Pre-Professional Advising offers a letter service for applicants to medical or dental school. We collect recommendation letters and submit a letter packet to the application service. We maintain the letters on file for five years should you need to reapply. If you are applying to medical or dental school in summer of 2020 to begin a program in fall 2021, now is the time

to sign up for the letter service. To sign up, complete the <u>2020 Pre-</u> <u>Professional Advising Letter Service Survey</u>. Once you have completed the survey, we will send you a confirmation email that includes a handout to give to your letter writers.

If you are an applicant to another health field such as physician assistant, physical therapy, occupational therapy, podiatry, optometry, etc. we cannot collect or submit letters of evaluation on your behalf. Follow the directions in your application portal to enter names of letter writers who will submit their letters directly to the portal. PHRM 49000 *Pharmacy for Non-Pharmacists* CRN 22674. 1 cr. ILS 49500 Information Skills for Health Professionals. First 8-weeks, 1 cr., Tues/Thurs 9:30-10:20am. A one-credit course that addresses database search techniques, citation management, differentiating between different types of research articles, and other topics germane to developing evidence-based practice. This course was designed, in part, for upper level undergraduates who are planning to go to professional school (DVM, MD, etc.) or graduate school in the health sciences.

Vet Up! Champions Program Accepting Applications

This program integrates face-to-face and interactive online learning to provide a 12-month structured curriculum to a cohort of 26 students each year including veterans and **first or second year undergraduate students**. Champions will prepare for entry into veterinary college by receiving mentorship, financial and cultural competence training, and gaining exposure to veterinary careers. Achieving Success in the Application Process (ASAP) prepare underrepresented students to gain admission to and succeed in law school. The program focuses on writing the personal statement, choosing letter writers, selecting law schools, preparing for the LSAT and the application process, managing debt and avoiding common application errors.
