President's Report 2020-21 PURA Activities

Assembled by Norman Long, President

- Three outdoor tours of the Haan Museum Sculpture Garden.
- Created a video tour of the flowerbeds and plantings around the Purdue main campus followed by a live session on Zoom explaining how Purdue Grounds prepares and maintains the many plantings on campus.
- Sponsored a common Read for PURA members on Letters to Neil Armstrong by James Hansen.
- Conducted a virtual Zoom with Purdue Archives on how they acquired a flight collection of the Armstrong letters.
- Sponsored a Zoom call on the virus responsible for COVID-19 and the various approaches being used to create vaccines.
- PURCare and Medicare Advantage Plans were extended unchanged for 2021 with lower premiums and utilization continues to exceed 2600 PURA members.
- An evaluation of the negotiations for the 2021 insurance package was completed and the results will be implemented during negotiations for the 2022 package.
- Alternatives to the PURCare plan were considered and it was determined any changes at this time would not be desirable.
- PURA was again represented on the Purdue Retirement Plan Committee, the University Compensation and Benefits Committee and on the University Parking and Traffic Committee.
- The "Organizing My Affairs" document was reviewed, updated, and technically corrected thru the efforts of Ken Scheeringa and the Benefits Committee with its rollout expected in early 2021-2022.
- Assistance was given to Purdue HR with COVID information for the Road to Retirement presentations.
- Continued monitoring government activity related to Affordable Healthcare and Tax Code revisions.
- Prepared several informational benefits related articles for the PURA newsletter.
- A virtual Purposeful Living in Retirement Zoom program with Dr. Phillip Low speaking about "Drugs in the Pipeline for Treating Human Disease" was offered in place of the popular PLIR in-person program cancelled due to the COVID pandemic.
- The Beck Center was reserved for an April 20, 2022 in-person PLIR event.

- PURA's initial virtual meeting was created to replace the annual in-person Kick-off Luncheon in September. Vice President, Bill Bell was the featured speaker, presenting Purdue's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Created the Media Communications Committee to facilitate monthly PURA meetings via Zoom and to create an archive of the meetings on the Website for PURA.
- With the passing of our long-time webmaster, Jim Daniel, Julie Kercher-Updike agreed to become our webmaster. Along with Jennifer Redden, Connie Bilyeu and Scott Ksander, the webpage is being kept current and under the control of the Media Communications Committee.
- Implemented the use of Qualtrics as an electronic tool to cast ballots for election of officers and passage of needed changes to the Bylaws and Policy Procedures Manual.
- Modified distribution and formatting, as well as moving to an ADA compliant email of the monthly PURA Newsletter through the Purdue Development Office and the application of Salesforce software.
- Continued the "Gold Star" *PURA News* with 10 monthly interesting and informative issues. Major topics included:

- Continued growth of the PURA Student Scholarship and the POA Endowment in honor of Martin and Patty Jischke with financial assistance awarded in 2021 to 19 Purdue Students.
- 47 donors made contributions to the PURA student scholarship endowment and 8 donors made contributions to the PURA Purdue Opportunity Award in honor of Martin/Patty Jischke.
- Overall, the two endowments grew \$49,550 and \$2,644 respectively during 2021.
- An anonymous donor gifted \$50,000.00 for matching (dollar for dollar) money for the two scholarship endowments
- Day of Giving for Purdue brought in approximately \$43,000 to the two endowments
- There were 50 handmade PURA Ornaments purchased resulting in another \$500.00 being given to the scholarship fund.
- The PURA Executive Board awarded \$350.00 to the Scholarship in honor of the service rendered to PURA by 10 retiring officers, committee chairs and committee members.
- PURA endowment information was kept before the PURA membership in three avenues:
 - PURA newsletter articles from August through April
 - Email information to PURA members in September, December, and April
 - Monthly Zoom meetings with selected recipients giving the Pledge to the American Flag December thru April.
- 23 PURA Hospitality and Executive Board members in conjunction with Custom Plus Pharmacy, planned, staffed, and hosted, the first ever, four day drive-thru flu shot

program for retirees at the Lafayette VFW on Duncan Road. In total 1,242 retirees and spouses received flu shots.

- PURA was granted a \$17,000.00 Allotment from Purdue for programs and operations.

All members from 2020-21 have agreed to continue service to the Benefits Committee and PURA through 2021-22. In addition, Rick Cosier has recently agreed to serve on the Benefits Committee.

B. Mission/Purpose:

Purdue University Policy IV.3.1, Status and Privileges of Retired Faculty and Surviving Spouses and Children, originally issued on May 10, 1971 and revised December 12, 2001, outlines the specific benefits extended by the University. It is the purpose of the Benefits Committee to expand upon and add to the specific University policies which contribute to the wellbeing of retirees. The primary responsibilities of the Benefits Committee are to assure the provision of comprehensive, affordable medical plans for retirees, negotiate with insurance providers, evaluate changes, monitor services and investigate alternatives where advantages may be gained. The committee strives to keep retirees aware of additional University benefits and privileges and promotes program improvements where possible. The Benefits Committee is also responsible for assuring representation on the Purdue Faculty Compensation and Benefits Committee, Parking and Traffic Committee and the Retirement Plan Committee.

C. Committee Goals 2020-2021:

- 1) Complete negotiation of the 2021 Insurance plans for both PURcare and Medicare Advantage by August 31, 2020 with the target of keeping premiums as low as possible, while maintaining top of the line coverage.
- 2) Promote via the Newsletter and direct mailings, 2021 premiums and plans by September 30, 2020.
- 3) Discuss a Medicare Advantage Plan as a possible alternative to PURCare and make recommendations by March 31, 2021.
- 4) Continue participation in the activities of the Parking and Traffic Committee, the Retirement Plan Committee and the Faculty Compensation Committee.
- 5) Actively engage in the Purposeful Living in Retirement (PLIR) Conference and the Road to Retirement Programs.
- 6) Promote the broad range of benefits available to University Retirees via articles in the PURA Newsletter.
- 7) Continue to monitor actions of external organizations (state and federal governments and organizations involved in the delivery of healthcare services and products) to assess the possible impact of these actions for PURA's members.

D. Accomplishments 2020-2021:

- 1) Working with University staff and healthcare consultants, PURcare and the Medicare Advantage Plans were extended for 2021. Both plans remained unchanged. The premium for Medicare Advantage, which is \$178.26 per month, was a reduction of \$19.81/month (10%). The

monthly premium for PURcare decreased slightly from \$281.80/mo. to, \$281.43/mo. Utilization of these insurance plans continues to be in excess of 2,600 members.

- 2) An evaluation of the negotiation of the 2021 insurance package was conducted during the Fall of 2020. Recommendations resulting from that evaluation will be utilized during the negotiation of the 2022 insurance package.
- 3) The Committee considered alternatives to the PURcare plan and determined that due to the exceptional elements of the PURcare plan, any change at this time would not be desirable.
- 4) During 2020-2021, Fred Ford was the PURA representative to the Purdue Retirement Plan Committee; Carolyn Roper was the representative to the University Compensation and Benefits Committee and Larry Pherson was the representative to the University Parking and Traffic Committee.
- 5) The technical issues existing in the “Organizing My Affairs” document were identified, corrected and tested. Rollout of the new and Improved “Organizing My Affairs” is expected during the early part of 2021-2022.
- 6) The following are examples of the Committee’s communication and marketing efforts:
 - a) Assistance to HR staff with “Road to Retirement” presentations were limited due to COVID.
 - b) Presentation at the annual Purposeful Living in Retirement conference was canceled due to the COVID.
 - c) Prepared articles for the PURA Newsletter.
- 7) Continued monitoring governmental activity relating to Affordable Healthcare and Tax Code revision.

All in all, the Benefits Committee had a successful 2021-2022 and was quite busy.

Campus and Community Activities Committee Annual Report 2020-2021

The goal of the Campus and Community Activities (CCA) Committee is to offer educational, informative, and entertaining activities of interest to members of the Purdue University Retirees Association and their guests. As a rule, committee activities do not require chartered transportation or collection of registration fees. Reservations are accepted to assure that adequate space and/or seating is available. Limitations of the number of reservations accepted is determined by the activity and venue. Announcements of events are placed in the PURA newsletter, through e-mail, and at the monthly luncheon programs when they are in operation.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, committee activities during the year were limited and modified from what has typically been done in the past. Most of the events were conducted virtually. Four events were offered during the 2020-21 academic year. The year's activities were as follows.

August/September, 2020

At the beginning of the academic year, the committee organized three outdoor tours of the Haan Museum Sculpture Garden on August 22, September 5, and September 15, 2020. The garden is located behind the Haan Museum of Indiana Art at 920 E. State Street in Lafayette. The tours were led by docent Sally Carter and featured 25 sculptures by Indiana artists in various media including metal, stone, glass, and ceramics. The garden, designed and cared for by Brenda Carton and her team of volunteers, is landscaped using native Indiana wildflowers. It is handicap-accessible and even has a garden theater with stage for outdoor performances. There is also a nature trail on the grounds. Because of COVID-19 restrictions and the need for social distancing, each tour was limited to just 6 people, so a total of 18 PURA members and guests participated.

October 2020

Working with four members of Purdue's Grounds Department (Phil Richey, Grounds Manager; Jeff Woolard, Crew Chief; Cathy Alkire, Greenhouse/Horticulture Specialist; and Stephanie Synesael, Greenhouse/Horticulture Specialist), the committee created a video-based virtual tour of flower beds and other plantings on Purdue's grounds. The video was made available to PURA members on YouTube (<https://youtu.be/IUkMmGWi5sk>). Then, as a follow-up, the members of the Grounds Department conducted a live session via Zoom on October 13 in which they explained how plants are grown from seed each year, the flower beds are prepared, and the beds are maintained throughout the growing season. The team then answered questions from PURA members attending. More than 350 people viewed the video tour of the campus grounds, and 12 PURA members attended the Zoom follow-up session.

November 2020

As has been the custom over the past several years, the committee sponsored a Common Read for PURA members. This year's Common Read featured *A Reluctant Icon: Letters to Neil Armstrong* by James R. Hansen from the Purdue Press. Tracy Grimm, Associate Head of

Archives and Special Collections and Barron Hilton Archivist for Flight and Space Exploration, conducted a virtual presentation on the book for interested PURA members via Zoom. During the talk, she discussed how the Archives came to possess its flight collection including Neil Armstrong's letters, and she highlighted several interesting letters from the book. She also showed a video clip from CBS This Morning – Saturday featuring James Hansen, the book's author and Neil Armstrong's biographer, who discussed letters written to Armstrong. Nine (9) PURA members attended the Common Read virtual session.

March 2021

The committee sponsored a special Zoom talk on the virus responsible for COVID-19 and the various approaches that are being used to create vaccines. On March 15th, Professor David Sanders of the Department of Biological Sciences, an expert on virology, gave a Zoom presentation for PURA members in which he discussed the SARS-CoV-2 virus, the stages of the virus life cycle, and how vaccine manufacturers exploit different phases of the virus life cycle to create vaccines. Following the informative presentation, Professor Sanders answered questions from those in attendance. A total of 77 PURA members attended the event.

The members of the committee are pleased to have been able to offer limited programming for PURA members during this year, despite the many challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions on public gatherings. We look forward to being able to return to our more customary in-person campus and community activities in the coming year.

Mission/Purpose:

Communications Updates:

This past year brought several changes to our committee. We mourned the sudden death of James R. Daniels in December, 2020. Jim was an excellent “behind-the-scene maintainer of the PURA website and suddenly we were forced to adjust our procedures, and obtain additional assistance to maintain the level of quality that our retirees were accustomed to seeing. The 2020 Annual PURA Kickoff Event, was presented virtually via Zoom, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, September 14, 2020, and originated from the PRF Atrium at the Kurz Purdue Technology Center.

The Kickoff Committee enlisted the assistance of Scott Ksander, PURA Information Technology Liaison, and PURA Board members to develop and execute a virtual version of the annual Kickoff event.

The Zoom event began at 12:45 pm with a Prelude count-down featuring a slide presentation featuring music and Purdue trivia facts, ending with a video of the Purdue Glee Club singing “Hail Purdue” at 2:00 pm.

124 participants joined the Zoom presentation. Several took advantage of the Zoom chat feature at the end of the program to ask questions of the presenters, inquire about PURA offerings, and make suggestions concerning future PURA endeavors. The chat inquiries were addressed at the end of the Zoom event, as time permitted, or were discussed via email after the event.

The featured speaker for the event was Bill Bell, Vice President for Human Resources at Purdue University. His topic was Purdue University’s response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Betty M. Nelson and the Arthur G. Hansen Awards were not awarded in 2020 but will be addressed in 2021.

The purpose and goal of the Purposeful Living in Retirement (PLIR) Committee is to plan and execute an annual conference to cover topics of interest to retirees and guests. The PLIR committee did not physically meet during the 2020-21 program year due to Covid-19 restrictions and there was not a 2021 PLIR conference. There was a virtual PLIR presentation on April 21, 2021 with Dr. Philip Low who had been scheduled as the keynote speaker for the 2020 PLIR. Dr. Low is the Ralph E. Corley Presidential Scholar in Chemistry and Director of the Purdue Institute for Drug Discovery. He spoke on “Drugs in the Pipeline for Treating Human Diseases”. A tape of the presentation is available on the PURA web site. There were 192 registrants including 22 guests for the virtual program with 91 logging for the presentation. The log in participation does not reflect the actual viewership since more than one person shared the screen for most of the registrants. Due to the success of PURA monthly meetings utilizing Zoom participation, the 2021 PLIR virtual program was marketed via PURA emails versus a direct mailing to local PURA members. The 2021 virtual program was coordinated by Special Events of the University Development Office. Studio and production aspects of the virtual program were provided by Elliott Hall of Music with an anticipated fee of \$1500.00. There was no solicitation of sponsorship fees for the 2021 virtual meeting. One major sponsor, United Healthcare, and 2 co-sponsors, Westminster Village and University Place, had requested PURA keep their sponsorship fees which had been received prior to the cancellation of the 2020 conference. Those fees are being used to cover the expenses of the 2021 program with those sponsors being acknowledged in writing and at the presentation for their support. There will be a final financial report for 2020-2021 filed for the Archives.

In anticipation of resuming a full PLIR conference in 2022, all current PLIR sponsors and co-sponsors were contacted in April 2021, prior to their 2022 fiscal year planning, to anticipate invoices for the 2022 conference in November 2021 with a due date in February 2022. Major sponsors Fidelity and TIAA were requested to increase their sponsorship fee from \$2500 to \$3000 to facilitate all the sponsors identified as “major” at the same \$3000 sponsorship fee. Co-sponsors were not asked to increase their fee of \$500 but did receive the 2022 invoice information before their fiscal planning for 2022.

In March 2021 the new Tippecanoe County Fairground facilities were toured as a potential PLIR conference site. In June 2021 discussions will begin with Purdue Conferences to explore their fee structure and coordination functions. At this time, in anticipation of a 2022 PLIR, the Beck Agriculture Center has been penciled in for April 20, 2022.

PURA Program Committee Annual Report 2020-2021

Program Committee Mission

The Program Committee provides a program for PURA members during the monthly luncheon meetings on the first Monday of each month except the month of September. The committee sets the luncheon meeting schedule for the coming year beginning with October and running through August of the following year. If the first Monday of the month falls on a national holiday, PURA does not meet that month. The annual “Kickoff” luncheon is normally held in early September.

The program committee chair is responsible for recruiting members to serve on the committee. Ideally the committee would have enough members so that each one would coordinate and host just one luncheon program speaker each year. The role of moderator/convenor for running the luncheon meetings is the responsibility of the PURA president. The program committee hosts are responsible for meeting the speaker upon arrival, helping them set up, providing their lunch, and introducing them to the audience.

A Year of Being Flexible

Covid-19 led to the cancellation of all PURA events after early March of 2020. Once it became obvious that the pandemic was not going away quickly new ways to meet and offer programming were explored. The June Board meeting was held via Zoom and planning got underway to hold the September Kickoff event via Zoom with the assistance of Scott Ksander. The decision was made to resume “lunch time” programming via Zoom in October.

Since a Transition Meeting was not held in 2020, program planning was conducted by email. Three programs postponed from 2019-2020 were rescheduled and based on committee feedback additional programs were selected and speakers secured. Planning only two to three months out gave flexibility if in person events might resume soon. Of special note was the Holiday Fun Event in December featuring a behind the curtain look at the virtual PMO Christmas Show presented by Bill Griffel, PMO Director.

Out of adversity and change good things do happen. Lunch time Zoom attendance (in parenthesis on program listing) was higher than historic in person numbers for almost all programs. Retirees who have moved away from the Purdue community were happy to be able to join us virtually. When we return to in person programming the plan is to continue with the virtual Zoom option. This allows our audience to be larger and our program recordings can be archived.

Program Committee Policies and Procedures were revised to remove references to MCL and make them less location specific. Several members have opted to leave the committee at the

end of the year and recruitment of new committee members was a challenge this year leading to a smaller committee roster. As of this writing a new Chair is also needed.

Thank you to the program committee members for their efforts and flexibility in working with our speakers this year. Planning for 2021-2022 will be a part of the annual Transition Meeting to take place via Zoom on June 2, 2021.

Primary Goal: The primary goal of this committee is to continue growing the PURA scholarship endowments to provide funds to assist as many Indiana students with significant financial need as possible. Additionally, this committee will mentor the scholarship recipients of the PURA Purdue Opportunity Award (POA) in Honor of Martin C. and Patty Jischke.

Scholarships Awarded: Financial assistance totaling \$11,300 was awarded from PURA scholarship endowment income for the 2020-2021 academic year. PURA Student Scholarship recipients received \$500.00 and PURA POA recipients received \$1,400. These funds are a portion of a complete financial aid package offered to Indiana students. Student selection and award amounts are administered by the Division of Financial Aid.

Communication with Students: The Scholarship Committee Chair requests the following information from a University Development Office representative: student name, degree area, hometown in Indiana, address, email address and cell phone number (sometimes the phone numbers are not available) and photograph of the student. The University Development Office routinely asked the students for letters of appreciation or thank you letters. Those are forwarded to the Scholarship Committee Chair. A welcoming email is sent to all of the students inviting them to participate in the monthly lunches and this year to monthly zoom meetings. With the creation of the Media Communication Committee, the ability to record students in the future will eliminate the conflicts with class schedules and hopefully result in more participation and exposure to the PURA members.

Scholarship Balance: The Book Value of the PURA Student Scholarship Endowment as of April 30, 2021, was \$199,591.87. The March 30, 2020 Book Value was \$150,041.64, resulting in an increase to the endowment of \$49,550.23. The Book Value of the PURA POA in Honor of Martin C. and Patty Jischke was \$52,694.44 as of April 30, 2021. The March 30, 2020, Book Value was \$50,050.44, resulting in an increase to the endowment of \$2,644. It is important to note that the April 30, 2021, balances in these endowment accounts did not reflect the April 28, 2021, Purdue Day of Giving gifts.

Donors and Gifts: Forty-seven donors made contributions to the PURA Student Scholarship Endowment. Of these individuals, eleven had never previously made donations and eighteen made multiple donations during the past year. Eight donors made contributions to the PURA POA in Honor of Martin C. and Patty Jischke. Of these individuals, one was a new donor and the remainder had made multiple gifts over the last several years.

An anonymous donor gifted \$50,000 for matching money for the two scholarship endowments. The match is dollar for dollar. There is no time limit for distribution of the matching dollars and the funds have been deposited in the PURA Activities and Opportunities Fund and will be transferred to the scholarship endowments as members make specific donations to either the PURA Student Scholarship Fund or the PURA POA Endowment in Honor of Martin C. and Patty Jischke. Matching money was first available for the September 9, 2020, Purdue Day of Giving.

Because of the COVID lockdown, the April 2020 Purdue Day of Giving was delayed until September 2020, giving this PURA year three distinct giving opportunities – Purdue Day of Giving September 9, 2020, Year-End Giving December 2020 and Purdue Day of Giving April 28, 2021. It is easier to report Purdue Day of Giving donations than year-end donations, as the Purdue Day of Giving totals are identified on the website for that event. Consequently, over \$36,000 was contributed on September 9, 2020 and approximately \$7,000 was contributed on April 28, 2021, to the two endowments. University Development provides the donor names and addresses for Year-End Giving with a total gift amount. Each of these contributions was matched dollar for dollar. Specific contributions:

Until this past year, Purdue Day of Giving contributions had averaged about \$5,000. PURA members were very generous this past year. To a \$15,000 anonymous gift, PURA members gave additional donations of slightly more than \$21,000 in September 2020 and donated another \$7,000 in April 2021. Both events were above the previous average.

Julie Kercher-Updike continued the challenging web development with assistance from Connie Bilyeu of the Communications Committee and is now in full control of the webpage.

The Benefits Committee asked for help in getting the PDF form “Organizing My Affairs” back to working order. Ken Scheeringa took on this task and worked on it over several months to not only get it working but also add additional features that will make this document even more valuable to the PURA membership. The Benefits Committee is currently testing Ken’s work and will announce this document in the coming months.

In April, the Committee assisted in an electronic ballot for the new officers and approval of changes to the Bylaws and Policy and Procedures Manual. The first-ever electronic ballot was a great success. The use of the Qualtrics tool is now available for future PURA ballots and surveys.

A project to expand the PURA Newsletter email list brought out some additional opportunities in January. The Purdue Development Office (UDO) is the source for PURA email data. UDO was in the process of moving their database to a new Salesforce application. This change presented the opportunity to use Salesforce tools for emailing the PURA Newsletter. The change allowed for better formatting options and moving to ADA compliant email. A great effort by the Communications Committee, the Media Communications Committee, and UDO brought this to reality. The stage is now set to get back to the email list question and locate retirees who are not currently receiving the Newsletter.

A great deal of work on Zoom, email, and web pages will continue into 2021-22 but the Committee is excited to meet those challenges.
