WHAT IS THE ROLE OF MY COACH?

MAPS Coaches are:

Purdue Promise Assistant Directors

MAPS Coaches will:

1. Work with you to set goals for academic success.
 2. Serve as an accountability partner.
 3. Help you anticipate challenges.
4. Help you develop plans to overcome obstacles.
 5. Point you to resources that will aid in your success.
 6. Provide support and motivation.
 7. Provide "tough love" when needed.
8. Celebrate with you when you succeed.
 9. Serve as a listening ear.

WHY DOES PURDUE PROMISE HAVE MAPS?

Purpose: To academically assist students who are:

- 1. in jeopardy of losing their 21st Century Scholars, Purdue Promise, Purdue Opportunity Award, Emerging Urban Leader, and/or Emerging Leader scholarships and/or Financial Aid;**
- 2. in jeopardy of losing their Purdue Promise leadership position; and/or**
- 3. are on academic probation.**

WHAT IS MAPS?

Meetings for Academic Progress and Success:

Students in the MAPS program are required to meet with an assigned Purdue Promise Coach up to **EIGHT** times throughout the semester to review and develop skills, as well as address obstacles that may negatively impact academic success.

These meetings last at least one hour, but depending on the students' needs, they can meet more often or longer with their Coach.

WHY ARE YOU HERE?

- Is your scholarship in jeopardy due to GPA?
- Are you on Academic Probation?
- Are you on Financial Aid warning/probation for SAP/PACE?
- Are you also not meeting State credit hour requirements?

THERE ARE A FEW REQUIREMENTS ...

As a MAPS participant you must:

attend MAPS orientation

meet with your Coach up to 8 times

complete 2 grade checks throughout the semester
(this requires meeting with each professor / TA)

create a success contract with your assigned Coach
during your first meeting and complete all
requirements as determined by your Coach

report your updated degree MAP to your Coach when
you meet with your advisor

Do not fail 6 or more credits or fall below the GPAs below.

HOW CAN I BE SUCCESSFUL IN MAPS?

- Be honest with your Coach!
- Read your syllabus. Understand grading scales.
- Use your Mortar Board.
- Use academic resources (if available) or study in KRACH.
- Utilize professor office hours every week.
- Monitor grades in Blackboard and on myPurdue.
- Seek out the SAC and/or CAPS.
- Follow your Coach's recommendations.
- Minimize the number of hours spent working.

Remember ... what you get out of MAPS is determined by what you put into MAPS.
