## **Week in Review**





The AAARCC celebrated our volunteers and student staff this year! Our appreciation event on April 24, 2025 started with presentations from AAARCC student staff Aerrielle Condino, HDFS Intern Jae Yon Kim, and AAARCC/Libraries and School of Information Studies PIC Student Staff Lamiya Laxmidhar. We would like to thank Associate Dean for Libraries and School of Information Studies, Mark Puente, for his presence at the event and for all his enduring support through the year for our PIC student staff.

We appreciated our 2024-2025 campus partners and especially CAPS, CCO, OWL, BFT, and CARE liaisons who holds regular liaison hours at the AAARCC and encourage students to use these units' services.

Our performance art groups, Lion Dance team (18 active members) and Jade Collective (5 active vocal ensemble members) contributed many hours of practicing and performing on campus, and our Lion Dance team also performs in the Greater Lafayette community. Thank you to our performing art leaders this year - Noelani Tanita, Thomas Cheng, and Raeann Risos. Special thank you to Jade Collective's partner, artist in residence Vlad Marasigan for your help this year.

The AAARCC's Language and Conversation hours created a cohort of volunteers (12 people) who shared their time weekly for attendees to learn and practice Chinese, Korean, Indonesian, and Vietnamese. This year's cohort has contributed a total of 266 volunteer hours, deepened connection and friendship with each other.

The AAARCC staff presented our volunteer data for 2024-2025. The AAARCC has a total of 116 registered volunteers who generously contributed a total of 655 hours collectively throughout the academic year.
