

FRAMEWORK FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

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Arrive a few minutes before and stay a few minutes after class

Learn students' names and use them in class

Walk around the room and chat with students

Respond to email in a timely way

Use student input in creating activities or assessments

Outline
expectations in
syllabus and
adhere to those
guidelines

Create
opportunities for
individual or
small group
meetings

FRAMEWORK FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

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Provide guidance on how subject matter can be used in career

Share personal examples on applying expertise to the real world

Update course annually and as subject matter changes

Discuss personal experience(s) with subject matter and its relevance

Use student feedback to modify course in future offerings

Outline how subject matter has evolved and how to stay current

FRAMEWORK FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

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Outline learning objectives at the beginning of class

Demonstrate how topic can be used in a given scenario

Collect feedback throughout course Provide opportunities for guided practice

performance






TIPS & ADVICE FROM MEMBERS OF THE TEACHING ACADEMY
