

Identity and Access Management

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Ensuring that the right people have the right access to the right systems at the right time across the Purdue system by securely managing digital identities throughout their entire lifecycle.

Problem: The current 30-year-old custom developed identity management system, ACMAINT, presents challenges and operational inefficiencies. These issues hinder adoption of modern security practices and negatively impact the overall user experience.

Recommendation: Implement a modern, off-the-shelf, identify and access management solution (SailPoint) that adheres to modern technology standards, and supports the entire Purdue ecosystem.

Benefits:

- Automate and streamline the provisioning, deprovisioning, and updating of user identities across the university's diverse systems and applications improving the onboarding experience for all users.
 - Reduce account provisioning time from 24–48 hours to 4 hours to help reduce the latency in Admissions notification processes for *students* and onboarding for *faculty and staff*.
- Replaces legacy systems and batch processes with a centralized platform that supports integration with cloud and on-premises resources, including ERP, LMS, research platforms, and other enterprise systems.
- Ensure compliance with regulatory requirements (e.g., FERPA, HIPAA, GLBA, NIST 800-53) and internal policies through improved visibility, auditability, and access certifications.
- Critical to the success of Zero Trust (modern cybersecurity framework operating on the principle "never trust, always verify").
