

- Acquire, preserve, and make available for research the often overlooked and underrepresented stories of women
- 230+ collections documenting women's history
- 149 years of women's history at Purdue

History of Women's Archives

- 2006 Susan Bulkeley Butler donates funds to establish the Women's Archives after hearing University Archivist, Sammie Morris, speak about absence of women in Purdue Archives collections
- 2010 Women's Archives Development Council, comprised of alumnae and donors, forms to raise funds for a fulltime archivist dedicated to managing the Women's Archives
- 2012 Purdue University President France A. Córdova provides funding to endow a full-time women's archivist position
