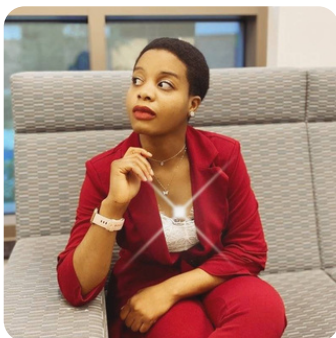
Amanda oversees the ServSafe program at Purdue where ~45 Health and Human Science Educators provide education to meet the food safety needs for food handlers throughout Indiana.

Amanda Deering is internationally known for her expertise in produce food safety and has widespread impact on safe growing and postharvest handling practices for fruits and vegetables that target growers, manufacturers, state agencies, and similar groups in other countries such as Afghanistan, Tajikistan, India, and Peru. Locally, Dr. Deering helps Indiana Stakeholders grow safe fruits and vegetables by teaching Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs) and working with growers on Good Manufacturing Practices (GMPs).



Carina was awarded Educator of the Year by the Indiana Latino Expo in 2019, has served on the Indiana Latino Institute's Latino (ILI) Legislative Committee, and was selected as part of the ILI Latino Leadership Circle in 2021. In 2021, Carina received the YWCA's Salute to Women Award. In 2021, under Carina's leadership, the LCC was awarded the Avanzando through College grant by UnidosUS to establish a program for first-generation college students.

Carina Olaru, a Chicago native and daughter of Mexican immigrants, joined Purdue University as the Director of the Latino Cultural Center (LCC) in 2016. In July 2020, Olaru was appointed as the Director of Student Advocacy and Education working to make Purdue and its regional campuses undocu-friendly. Under her tenure, the LCC has expanded and sees about 1,4000 visitors a month. Carina was awarded Educator of the Year by the Indiana Latino Expo in 2019, has served on the Indiana Latino Institute's



especially within the African Context. At Purdue, she is the first female president of the Nigerian Students Association at Purdue where she has helped lead innovative projects, including several webinars and seminars in the area of professional development.

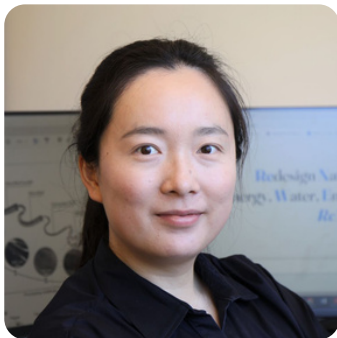

Ashima Krishna is Clinical Associate Professor in the John Martinson Honors College. Prior to joining the Honors College, she was Associate Director of the Purdue Policy Research Institute and a courtesy faculty in the School of Interdisciplinary Studies in Purdue's College of Liberal Arts. She is an architect and historic preservation planner whose research spans the management of historic urban landscapes and adaptive reuse of religious historic structures and landscapes, with a particular focus on intersection with community development and equity issues and resulting policy challenges. Dr. Krishna has examined issues related to historic preservation planning and urban conservation in United States and India and continues to highlight the ways in which the historic built environment can be preserved, managed, and planned for. Her published work has been featured in *Journal of Urbanism*, *Preservation Education and Research*, *Change Over Time*, and *Journal of American Planning Association* among others. Her co-edited book *Heritage Conservation in Postcolonial India: Approaches and Challenges* was published by Routledge in 2020.

Based on the cutting-edge fundamental research in energy science, heat & mass transfer and materials innovation, the Li group strives to apply fundamental knowledge to establish a toolbox of natural materials to create sustainable engineering solutions towards energy, water, environment, and devices. Dr. Li is the recipient of many awards and was recently recognized as a 2022 Packard Fellow. The Packard Fellowship is highly competitive and is one of the largest non-governmental fellowships for research.
