

**LaVerne Noyes Scholarship Application for 2017-18**  
**Purdue University**

The LaVerne Noyes Scholarship is awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need. Financial need is determined by the analysis of the income and asset information reported on the FAFSA. Applicants who do not demonstrate financial need will not be awarded the scholarship. All applicants will be notified in writing about the outcome of the scholarship selection. The scholarship is intended to assist in the payment of tuition and fees. If the tuition and fees are being paid by another source, the scholarship will not be offered to the student.

Provide the following documents. First consideration is given to those applicants whose completed information is received by **January 31, 2017**. *Please do not sent original documents, photocopies are accepted.*

Complete application form items 1-10.

Verify applicant's relationship to service person. Provide notarized statement from parent attesting to relationship or provide copies of all birth certificates to illustrate student's relationship to service person.

Copy of service person's Discharge Certificate.

Verification that *one* of the following criteria is met, usually found on enlistment and/or discharge documents:

Service began before May 12, 1918

Service was overseas during WWI

Service person died in service during WWI

*Under* the will of LaVerne Noyes, deceased, the Trustees of his estate have made available to Purdue University a portion of the income of the trust estate to be used in paying “the tuition, in part or in full, of deserving students **needing** this assistance to enable them to procure a university or college training. This is to be done without regard to differences of sex, race, religion or political part, but only for those who shall be citizens of the United States of America and either

“*First*, shall themselves have served in the army or navy of the United States of America in the war into which our country entered on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1917, and were honorably discharged from such service, or

“*Second*, shall be descended by blood from someone who has served in the army or navy of the United States in said war, and who either is still in said service or whose said service in the arm or navy was terminated by death or an honorable discharge.

“The purpose of LaVerne Noyes in establishing these scholarships was to express his gratitude to, and in slight degree to reward, those who ventured the supreme sacrifice of life for this country and for mankind in this war for the liberty of the world, and also to aid in keeping alive, for generations to come, the spirit of unselfish patriotic devotion which these men displayed and without which no free government can long endure.”
