## INTRODUCTION

PurdueVotes Coalition is a student-led, University-supported committee that works to increase voter registration, voter engagement, and create civic-minded individuals. PurdueVotes was first established in 2018 and has joined the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge and the Big Ten Voting Challenge. The Coalition is comprised of student organizations, Purdue departments, community partners and is partnered with the Office of the President.

Voting is an important part of the democratic process and should be accessible to all, especially college students. Many students come to college not registered and unaware of the voting process. Our job is to teach these students the election process and help them become more civically engaged.

## FALL 2022 ACTION PLAN GOALS: 1

- Increase overall voter registration rate to 80% (2014: 62.7% & 2018: 76%)
- Increase voting rate of Asian student population voting to 18% (2014: 1.6% & 2018: 9.6%)
- Increase voting rate of Latinx student population voting to 30% (2014: 5.8% & 2018: 25.4%)
- Increase voting rate of Black student population voting to 33% (2014: 7.2% & 2018: 27.6%)
- Increase voter registration rate in the College of Science

## STRATEGY

PurdueVotes breaks down our voting strategy and tactics into three different phases: Registration, Education, and Participation

### Phase I: Voter Registration

- Registration Tabling Events: BGR, RHA Day, Constitution Day, ASUB Back2School Bash, National Voter Registration Day
- Voter Registration Education Video is created and distributed through the University-wide College Competition
- Partner with cultural centers and University Residences for voter registration tabling
- Outreach: Creating connections and relationships with student organizations, community partners, and Purdue Departments

### Phase II: Voter Education

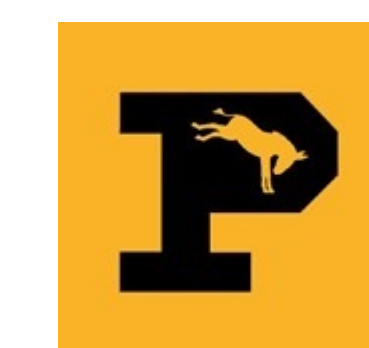
- Create Voter Education guides: Voter Guide, Absentee Ballot Information, Voter FAQ zine
- Voter FAQ Tabling: Tabling to answer questions about absentee ballots, voting locations, and the election process

### Phase III: Voter Participation

- Host an on-campus voting locations: Early voting at Mackey Arena and Election Day at KRACH leadership center
- Offer transportation to campus polling locations
