The Bridging Horizons challenge is for groups to complete projects in their communities that enhance quality of life for people with disabilities. Possible projects include building a wheelchair access ramp, modifying a piece of farm equipment to accommodate a disability, or improving the accessibility of your county fairgrounds.

Both youth and adult service organizations are eligible, such as FFA Chapters, 4-H Clubs, Jr. Leaders, Boy Scouts/Girl Scouts, Young Farmers, Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions, volunteer fire departments, church groups and others.
