What is STAR?

- One of two primary orientation programs at Purdue University (Boiler Gold Rush)
- Purdue's Summer Transition, Advising and Registration (STAR) program is designed to ease a student's transition to life at the University. Attendance at STAR helps students connect with the University community, meet with those who will aid them in their academic career, and establish relationships that will be important to their success. Students, along with their guests, attend sessions and perform tasks to prepare for their academic experience.
- In 2018, over 7,000 students and nearly 11,000 guests participated; over 1,500 in VSTAR



This email provides detailed information needed to make your STAR visit a success. Please forward this message to any guests joining you at STAR so everyone who attends will know what to expect. Students should continue to check their Purdue email daily to stay informed.

Note that all STAR participants should plan to be on Purdue's campus from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time during their STAR session. Upon arrival, please park in the North Stadium Lot at Ross Ade Stadium. Shuttles will pick up every 10 minutes to transport you to your check-in location, which varies depending on your STAR date.

IN THE WEEKS LEADING UP TO YOUR STAR SESSION

Students should log in to the myPurdue student portal to finish any outstanding items on their New Student Task List, and complete tasks that have early deadlines:

- Click on the "Select your STAR session" link to register guests at least one week before your STAR session, and double check your STAR date by clicking on "Current Enrollments"
- Complete the Student Information Form at least one week before your STAR session
- Upload your ID card photo at least one full business day before your STAR session
- Complete Immunization requirements
- Complete myCareerPlan
- Request transcripts for any Dual Credit courses. Read more on Purdue's Transfer Credit website
- Take the ALEKS Math Assessment (optional)

Review the STAR schedule: Download the PurdueGuide app from the Google Play store or the Apple app store. The app will provide an electronic schedule of STAR sessions.

- After downloading the PurdueGuide app, select the "Campus" tab in the lower right corner and tap "Find Guides."
- Select the STAR guide that correlates with your visit date and tap "Add Guide."
- Hit the back button. You will now be able to access the STAR guide under the "My Guides" section at the bottom of the Campus tab.



IN THE DAYS LEADING UP TO YOUR STAR SESSION

- Review what to expect at STAR please make special note of things to bring, including your printed parking pass.
- Check the weather forecast for West Lafayette.
- Make a list of questions for your academic advisor. Students should bring these questions with them to their advising appointment.
- Decide whether to take a Foreign Language Placement exam or the written test for COM 114 while on campus.
- For students with disabilities, STAR provides an opportunity to prioritize some accommodations before course registration. Please call Purdue's Disability Resource Center (DRC) at 765-494-1247 at least one week before your STAR date to schedule an appointment to discuss accommodations for barriers related to physical access, course materials, and timing of classes.

THINGS TO DO ON YOUR STAR DAY

- Wear comfortable shoes!
- Bring your Purdue University ID number, a government-issued ID, and Purdue career account log-in information (username and password).
- Remember Purdue is on Eastern Daylight Time (EDT).
- Please arrive between 7 and 7:30 a.m. to ensure a smooth check-in process.
- Individual schedules may vary, but attendees should plan to be on Purdue's campus until 5 p.m.
- Visit Purdue University Pharmacy, the only on-campus pharmacy at Purdue, for your prescriptions, over the counter items, and immunization needs.

If you need to change your STAR date, you can make this change by visiting the New Student Task List on myPurdue and clicking on "Select Your STAR Session."




