Purdue University police officer will accompany you to your destination to ensure your safety. **Emergency Telephone System** As you walk around campus, you'll notice yellow or black boxes topped with bright blue lights—these are part of Purdue's Emergency Telephone System. With nearly 300 emergency boxes placed at intersections and other key

locations, they're easy to spot thanks to their distinctive blue lights and markings like "Emergency" or "911." To use one:


•You'll be connected to a Purdue Police Officer within seconds, and help will be dispatched.

•Press the button to activate the box.

•The blue light will begin flashing.

Helpful Tip:If you're in need of emergency assistance but must keep moving, you can press the button on each emergency box you pass. This alerts Purdue Police to your real-time location and activates the flashing blue

lights, helping responders track your path and reach you quickly.
