Emmanuel Cooper and Colleagues Publish Sweetpotato Research



The first chapter of **Emmanuel Cooper**'s MS thesis entitled "Evaluation of critical weed-free period for three sweetpotato (Ipomoea batatas) cultivars," was recently accepted and published by Weed Science. The journal article is co-authored by HLA members **Stephen Meyers**, **Ashley Adair**, and **Jeanine Arana** as well as Katie Jennings from North Carolina State University and Kevin Gibson and Bill Johnson from the Purdue University Department of Botany and Plant Pathology. HLA's Spring Fest 2024


