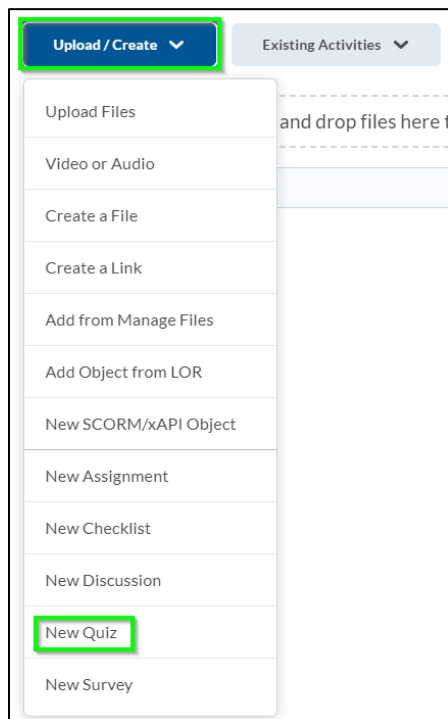


Building an Honor Code quiz will enable you to require students to agree to the Honor Code prior to beginning an assessment. First, you will need to create the Honor Code quiz. Second, you will need to add release conditions to your assessment quiz. This will ensure students have agreed to the Honor Code before being able to start the assessment quiz.

Create the Honor Code Quiz

To build this in Brightspace, open the course for which you would like to add an assessment. Click 'Content' and navigate to the module where the quiz will reside. Click 'Upload/Create' and select 'New Quiz' from the drop-down.




Enter a title and instructions for the quiz. **NOTE:** The 'Hide from Users' setting must be unchecked for the quiz to be available to students.


Click 'Save' and then click 'Quiz Setup'.

While on the *Properties* tab, click 'Add/Edit Questions'.


Click 'Add', select 'New Question' from the drop-down, and then select the 'True or False' option.



Copy and paste the Honor Code statement into the 'Question Text' field. Check the radio button next to 'True'. Leave the default point setting as 1. Then click 'Save'.






Click the *Assessment* tab and check the box next to 'Allow attempt to be set as graded immediately upon completion'.


Create and Attach Release Conditions to Your Assessment Quiz

Create your assessment quiz in the same module that the Honor Code quiz resides. When you reach the quiz setup options, select the *Restrictions* tab. Scroll down. Under 'Release Conditions', click 'Create and Attach'.


Click 'Select Condition Type' and select 'Score on a quiz'.



Under 'Condition Details', click 'Select Quiz' and select the 'Honor Code' quiz.




