# Congratulations Dr. Patrick A. Zollner 2025 Dreamer Award Recipient



We are excited to recognize Dr. Patrick A. Zollner for receiving the 2025 Martin Luther King, Jr. Dreamer Award. Zollner was one of three recipients to receive the award which recognizes individuals or organizations within the Purdue community whose contributions embody Martin Luther King Jr.'s vision of service to others and further the university's commitment to diversity.

Zollner is a professor in the Forestry and Natural Resources Department with the College of Agriculture, a member of the Sloan Indigenous Graduate Partnership (SIGP) leadership team, and has served as a primary research advisor for five Indigenous graduate students. He has fostered a long-standing relationship with the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission (GLIFWC) which supports the exercise of treaty rights for Ojibwe tribes in Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan.

On behalf of the NAECC and Sloan Program, we offer our heartfelt congratulations and appreciation to Pat for his outstanding contributions.






