



PURDUE FEDERAL WORK STUDY PROGRAM

Federal Work-Study (FWS) is a form of financial aid that provides funding for on and off-campus jobs. It allows students to earn money to help pay for education expenses, potentially reducing their need for loans. The program is designed so that FWS funds and the student's employer share in paying the student's wages. Students gain valuable work experience, build professional skills, and explore career paths while earning money to support their education.

More Information

1. Eligibility:

To qualify for the Federal Work-Study Program, you must be a Purdue student enrolled at least half-time, demonstrate financial need through the FAFSA, and be offered a Federal Work-Study award by the Division of Financial Aid.

2. How to Apply:

To apply for the Federal Work-Study Program, accept your FWS award in the <u>myPurdue portal</u>. Search for job opportunities at

3. Payment

Students receive bi-weekly paychecks for their work.
Earnings can be used for day-to-day expenses and are not applied directly to tuition bills.
