THE EXPERIENCE

Orientation Programs at Purdue University facilitate experiences where new students are welcomed "All Aboard Purdue", a four-step process to start their journey as Boilermakers. The four steps are interconnected to help transition 10,000+ incoming undergraduate students to campus each year. We are excited to welcome a new professional to join our team via a vacant Program Coordinator (PC) role in West Lafayette (WL), Indiana.

The full slate of office programs include:

Purdue 101 & Purdue 102, a required online orientation experience that guides students through the course scheduling process, connects them to their academic advisor, and introduces campus resources to help students make a strong start at Purdue.

Summer Visit Days, an optional program that gives students and their families the opportunity to see campus and engage with staff after making their decision to attend Purdue.

Boiler Gold Rush International (BGRi), an optional program created to prepare newly arriving international students to transition to Purdue University, the state of Indiana, and the United States of America.

Boiler Gold Rush (BGR), an optional multi-day program that welcomes new beginner and transfer students to campus to introduce campus traditions, university resources, and facilitate personal connections the week before classes begin in the fall semester.

Boiler Cold Rush (BCR), an optional multi-day program that welcomes new beginner and transfer students to campus in the spring semester.

Beyond these experiences at Purdue
University, the Orientation Programs team are
active and **committed to professional development** across several networks
including the Association for Orientation,
Transition, and Retention in Higher Education
(NODA) at both national and community
levels, and an active collaborative of
orientation and transition professionals across
Big Ten Conference institutions.

Applicant Requirements: An earned Bachelor's Degree and two years of professional experience related to the position, with the anticipated annual salary range of \$43,600-\$48,750 and a comprehensive benefits package, moving relocation, and professional development opportunities.

POSITION OVERVIEW

Reporting to an Orientation Programs Associate Director in West Lafayette (WL), this Program Coordinator (PC) position is a productive professional working independently with general supervision to prepare and execute work within the Orientation Programs team.

This position's primary responsibilities will support pre-arrival programs: Purdue 101 and Purdue 102 (our online orientation experiences) and mentorship of student leaders. This role will also support on-site programs in WL for new beginners: Summer Visit Days, Boiler Gold Rush International, Boiler Gold Rush, and Boiler Cold Rush.

For Purdue 101 and Purdue 102, this may include, but is not limited to, the collection and organization of information from campus partners, the development of online orientation modules, improving the experience for incoming students, program assessment annually and longitudinally, and critical attention to student progress through the program.

Our student leadership model is represented in WL and Indianapolis locations. For the student leadership model, you will directly oversee WL members of the Student Orientation Committee (SOC), an executive group of ten, third-year orientation leaders who hold different individual and small group responsibilities to support the

success of their mentees. This group of students are hired for one full year, from October to October.

The SOC serve as mentors for over 150 Team Supervisors (TS), a mid-level leadership role for second-year orientation leaders. The PC's provide oversight for the SOC to execute curriculum and trainings that support personal growth and development, resulting in the TS's ability to mentor entry-level leaders and provide on-site logistical support of welcome programs. Team Supervisors also enroll in a 1-credit Leadership Development Seminar which is taught by Orientation Programs professional staff members. TS are hired in October and stay through August.

Team Supervisors serve as mentors for the over 600 Team Leaders (TL), an entry-level leadership role for first-year and returning orientation leaders. The PC's provide oversight for the SOC to recruit students and create a training curriculum so TL can lead 15-20 new students during welcome week programs. TL are hired in March and stay through August.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMS

As a member of the Orientation Programs team, the Program Coordinator will join a dedicated staff committed to innovating and continuously moving programs and experiences forward for new students and staff. Seeking to understand the experience of students, with the desire to think critically and thoughtfully about supporting the Orientation Programs mission of introducing and connecting all new undergraduate students in West Lafayette and Indianapolis to Purdue University, will be critical for a Program Coordinator in this role.

This position will work in-person on campus in West Lafayette, Indiana, but will work closely with members of the Orientation Programs team based in Indianapolis, Indiana. The nature of work in orientation is cyclical and has peak seasons, which sometimes requires staff members to work some nights and weekends, and at times may give the opportunity for flexibility and hybrid work.
