Campus Affairs

The purpose of the Campus Affairs Committee is to serve the Purdue academic advising community and the Purdue student body by acting as an advocate in any area of the University which impacts the overall student experience, the PACADA membership, and academic advising as a profession.

The Committee sponsors the PACADA Student Services Update twice per academic year, fall and spring. The Update is a venue for faculty and staff to inform the PACADA membership about new programs and initiatives that will influence academic advising and student services. It has also served as a venue for introducing new directors of programs/ departments, and for advisors to provide an overview of their experiences at local, regional, and national conferences. The PACADA membership is invited to attend the meetings which take place once every 4 to 6 weeks during a semester. The first meeting of the semester is spent planning the Update. Subsequent meetings involve discussing advising/student issues, what is happening within the student-services realm locally and nationally, the creation of new programs/departments and how they will impact advising, and best-advising practices, etc... As a result of these discussions it is the hope that "action items" will be generated that need to be addressed at the University level.

Professional Development

The purpose of the PACADA Professional Development Committee is to promote the individual and corporate professional growth of the membership for the benefit of the advisors, students, and University as a whole.

The Committee sponsors the annual Fall Retreat, schedules speakers for the Annual Business Meeting, sponsors PACADA Presents, hosts a Brown Bag Lunch Series, and also facilitates the Professional Development Grant application and award process. The Fall Retreat is held each September, as an opportunity for PACADA members to come together at a site off campus and reflect upon the changes and updates within advising. Each year has a different theme, with speakers sometimes coming from within the university and sometimes coming from outside the university. PACADA Presents is typically held in April, and has been offered both annually and bi-annually. PACADA Presents provides members an opportunity to practice their presentation skills, share updates from happenings within the university, and a venue to share new and exciting practices within the field of advising. The Brown Bag Lunch Series is held monthly and is an informal way for PACADA members to learn about and discuss current topics/issues in higher education. The Professional Development Grants are awarded each year at the Fall Retreat. The Committee delivers communication to the PACADA community regarding grant opportunities and reviews all applications before awarding grants. The PACADA membership is invited to join the Committee and attend any of our meetings to help plan and facilitate the events and responsibilities. Meetings are held monthly throughout the academic year, and as needed during the summer months. We welcome new ideas and new members

Research Bytes

Starting students off right: Time management as a key to academic success

As we meet with and encourage our incoming class of new beginners, in addition to all things registration, and plans of study, I have focused much of my attention on time management skills with my students. As a relatively new advisor, beginning shortly before the Pandemic struck, and the biggest observational takeaway from the pandemic for my students seemed to be how to manage their time, particularly in the light of forced online or hybrid courses. As many others, I was intrigued to learn whether online or hybrid modalities posed a different type of time management style to set students up for success as well as the impact on online learning modalities on persistence and student success.
