Wondering what professional school preparation activities you can do over winter break? Here are a few ideas!

- Plan ahead for summer volunteer opportunities. Visit the PPA website for handouts on <u>PreLaw Volunteer Opportunities</u> and <u>PreHealth</u> <u>Volunteer Opportunities</u> (also <u>Summer Opportunities</u>).
- Do you want to become certified over the summer to work as a <u>CNA</u>, EMT, etc.? Visit websites of local community colleges, assisted living facilities, or healthcare organizations to look for courses. Google search. Call employers in your area and ask where their employees train locally. Then, follow up with those leads. Note application processes and deadlines. Don't wait until summer begins to start looking for opportunities.

Summer Opportunities

Summer Health Professions Education Program

The <u>Summer Health Professions Education Program</u> (SHPEP) is a FREE, sixweek transformative enrichment program for high school and college students interested in the health professions. SHPEP's goal is to strengthen academic proficiency and career development of students underrepresented in the health professions and to prepare them for successful application and matriculation to health professions schools. In addition to dentistry and medicine, the program offers opportunities to explore nursing, optometry, pharmacy, physical therapy and public health. The deadline to apply is February 5, 2023.

University of Detroit Mercy School of Dentistry Summer Enrichment Program

The <u>Summer Enrichment Program</u> is designed to assist students from underresourced and disadvantaged backgrounds with gaining admission to dental school, and encourages participants to become practicing dentists in medically underserved areas. SEP is a 9-week (4 weeks self-paced and 5 weeks inperson) structured program that offers free housing and DAT Preparation, and a stipend to cover sustenance and travel expenses. Various educational and professional development experiences will be afforded to participants. Application deadline is February 15, 2022. University of Michigan SMART Program

UM-SMART is designed for undergraduate students who have an interest in obtaining a combined MD/PhD degree leading to a career in academic medicine as a physician-scientist performing basic research relevant to human health and disease. As a UM-SMART summer research fellow, students work full-time in a basic research laboratory under the mentorship of a research faculty member. Dates are May 30, 2023 - August 4, 2023. Applications are due January 20, 2023.

NYU Langone Summer Volunteer Programs

The Ronald O. Perelman Department of Emergency Medicine offers volunteer programs to undergraduates, recent graduates (within one to two years of graduation date and program start date), post-baccalaureates, and master's students who are interested in a career in emergency medicine or other area of medicine.
