On **Saturday, May 5**, the Purdue Faculty Association is organizing an **Indianapolis brewery tour**, picking up on a tradition that started five years ago. We'll pick you up and drop you off at the Purdue Memorial Union (**10 am departure**) and shuttle you around to four different establishments. (Provisionally, these are: St. Joseph's Brewery, Flat 12 Bierwerks, Black Acre, and Hotel Tango Artisanal Distillery. **Estimated return 6:45 pm.**)
