Faculty want to be successful...

- ...And are frustrated when:
 - Expectations are not clear for promotion, tenure, raises, awards & honors
 - Tasks that detract time and attention from their professional goals and primary emphases are inequitably distributed (service, committees, teaching, etc.)
 - There are not enough resources or space to get work done

2. Faculty want to work in an inclusive, collegial, supportive environment

- ...And are frustrated when:
 - They encounter un-inclusive, un-collegial, and un-supportive (or worse) people and environments
- 3. Faculty want their voice and opinions to be heard and to matter
 - ...And are frustrated when:
 - The shared governance system is less effective than desired
 - They are not included in decision-making processes
 - They feel isolated

C/P Faculty Value Statement




