The following disclosure is applicable to the following face-to-face licensure programs offered within the College of Health and Human Sciences at Purdue University West Lafayette:

Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology

The above program at Purdue University holds full accreditation from the <u>American Psychological</u> <u>Association</u> (APA) and the <u>Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System</u> (PCSAS). Purdue's Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology meets all educational requirements for licensure in all states, except for California, Michigan, New York, and North Dakota, where requirements are not met.

The program also meets educational requirements for licensure in the U.S. Virgin Islands, but we are unable to make a determination as to the satisfaction of requirements in American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, and Puerto Rico, due to a lack of information.

It is important to understand that the out-of-state requirements vary by state and can change with little to no warning. Students seeking licensure or certification in another state should inquire directly to the jurisdiction where employment is desired.
