The following disclosure is applicable to the following face-to-face licensure programs offered within the College of Engineering at Purdue University:

All Face-to-Face (not online) Engineering undergraduate and graduate degrees

The following licensure programs within Purdue University's College of Engineering are accredited by the <u>Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology</u> (ABET). State boards of Engineering and Technology at the very least require Professional Engineer licensure applicants to graduate from an ABET accredited school. This accreditation affirms that Purdue University's Professional Engineering programs satisfy all necessary education requirements to sit for the required examinations and earn professional licensure.

It is highly important for students to understand that state-by-state requirements vary in terms of examination requirements, professional experience, and specific coursework. Thus, it is imperative that students consult the State Engineering Board where employment is desired for more specific information.

Note: Purdue University is unable to make a determination as to the satisfaction of its program for educational requirements in the jurisdiction of American Samoa due to a lack of information.

Out-of-state requirements are not concrete and subject to change with little to no warning, making it even more important for students to inquire directly to the jurisdiction of desired employment.
