The following disclosure is applicable to the following face-to-face licensure programs offered within the realm of Pharmacy at Purdue University Northwest:

Doctor of Pharmacy

The following licensure program within Purdue University's College of Pharmacy is accredited by the <u>Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education</u> (ACPE). Pharmacy licensure is regulated by the individual state, and at the very least, state boards require Doctor of Pharmacy licensure applicants to graduate from an ACPE accredited school to sit for the <u>North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination</u> (NAPLEX). This accreditation affirms that Purdue University's Doctor of Pharmacy program satisfies all necessary education requirements to sit for the required examinations and earn professional licensure.

It is highly important for students to understand that state-by-state requirements vary in terms of specific examination requirements (other than NAPLEX), professional experience, and specific coursework. Thus, it is imperative that students consult the <u>Board of Pharmacy</u> where employment is desired for more specific information.

Note: Purdue University is unable to make a determination as to the satisfaction of its program for educational requirements in the jurisdiction of American Samoa and the Northern Mariana Islands due to a lack of information.

Out-of-state requirements are not concrete and subject to change with little to no warning, making it even more important for students to inquire directly to the jurisdiction of desired employment.
