A Blueprint: The Institution

- Lever our Land-Grant Mission in Every Appropriate Way
 - Establishing relevance: take full advantage of linkages between research, Extension, and teaching missions
- Adopt an Outside-In Perspective
 - o Bring stakeholders inside through creative, intentional listening
- Reframe Success Metrics
 - Reward engaged scholarship, recognize traditional metrics won't hold
- Be an Authentic Storyteller
 - Communicate on stakeholder terms: what does it mean, why does it matter, how do they want to communicate?

A Blueprint: Undergraduate Programs

- Elevate the Teaching Mission
 - o Innovate, reward, celebrate, publicize teaching and learning
- Rethink Access and Completion
 - o Simplifying communication of costs and benefits of college; persistent barriers/gaps must be addressed
- Career-Ready Focus
 - o Deep look at what is needed to prepare students for careers in a dynamic work world
- Residential Must Be Experiential
 - Fundamental question: why should students come to a physical campus?
