

WHAT IS AN AUDIOLOGIST?

- Audiologists are health care professionals working to prevent, diagnose, and manage hearing and balance disorders for people of all ages.
- An audiologist has a master's or doctoral degree and over 1,800+ hours of clinical training.
- Audiologist and Hearing Aid Dispenser: What Is the Difference?

PREVALENCE OF HEARING LOSS

- Increases with age
 - 1–3 of every 1,000 babies born in the U.S. have hearing loss
 - Approximately 15% of adults 18+ report difficulty hearing
 - > 80% of individuals 80+ have some degree of hearing loss¹





WHY IS TREATMENT IMPORTANT

- Untreated hearing loss is linked to cognitive decline, dementia, falls, social isolation, and depression. It can also affect quality of life at home and work.
- Individuals with hearing loss are at increased risk of developing dementia, compared to those without hearing loss.³


On average, adults wait about 7 years to pursue treatment for Only 20%-30% a hearing loss of adults with hearing difficulties wear a hearing aid.



IS AN OVER-THE-COUNTER (OTC) HEARING AID RIGHT FOR ME?

OTC HEARING AIDS

The U.S. Congress passed legislation in 2017 requiring the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to develop regulations for over-the-counter (OTC) hearing aids. The intent of the legislation was to offer adults with perceived mild-to-moderate hearing loss the opportunity to purchase a device on their own at a lower cost.



OTC hearing aids:

- Are meant for individuals with perceived mild-to-moderate hearing loss.
- Are intended for individuals aged 18 years and older.
- Do not require a hearing evaluation.
- Have a "one-size-fits-most" design.
- May reduce barriers to hearing health care.



OTC HEARING AID LEGISLATION TIMELINE

October 2015:

President's Council of
Advisors on Science
and Technology

(PCAST) recognizes the
impact of untreated
hearing loss on an aging
population. PCAST
makes several
recommendations,
including the creation of
a new category of basic
hearing aids to be sold
over the counter.

August 2018: Hearing care associations (AAA, ADA, ASHA, IHS) release Regulatory Recommendations for OTC Hearing Aids: Safety and Effectiveness, a consensus paper.

October 2021: The FDA releases proposed rule for OTC hearing aids for adults 18 and older with mild to moderate hearing loss.













August 2017: The FDA Reauthorization Act of 2017 directs the FDA to develop regulations for over-the-counter hearing aids, with the devices to be made available to the public by 2020.

2020: **COVID-19** pandemic occurs.

August 2022: The FDA releases final rule for OTC hearing aids. Effective date is 60 days following publication in the Federal Register.


FIRST STEP: CONSULT AN AUDIOLOGIST

- Do you have concerns about your hearing? Get tested by a licensed audiologist. This is the best first step, even if planning to buy an OTC hearing aid.
- The audiologist will check for common medical causes of hearing loss, like too much earwax.
- They will perform a hearing evaluation to check for hearing loss. If you are experiencing hearing loss, they will describe severity, type, and options.





OTC VS. PRESCRIPTION HEARING AIDS: WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

WHERE DO I BUY AN OTC HEARING AID?


- Local pharmacies, large retail chains, and online providers may sell OTC hearing aids.
- It is important to read all the information on the "box" before buying a device; you may not be able to return it.
- Many audiologists will still be able to help you with basic maintenance of these devices for a service fee.









- Hands-free cell phone calling and "tap" control
- Own voice pick-up
- Tap control feature allows controlling the hearing aid by a "double tap" instead of using the hearing aid button or a remote control
 - Pause/resume streaming from a Bluetooth device
 - Accept/end phone calls
 - Start/stop voice assistant (Siri, Google etc.)
