When was 4-H established?

- **1802**
- **1895**
- **1902**

- Began in Clark County, Ohio
- Started to give hands on learning experiences to youth
- Meant to make public school education more connected to country life



What were 4-H clubs originally called?

#### Important Dates for Indiana 4-H

- 1904- Hamilton County, Indiana began Corn Clubs and Corn Growing Contests
- 1914- President Woodrow Wilson signs the Smith-Lever Act authorizing Cooperative Extension work between the Land Grant colleges and the USDA. This allows for Extension to provide instruction in agriculture and home economics.
- County agents and leaders began organizing 4-H clubs


#### What do the 4 H's stand for?

- Head, Heart, Hands, Health

#### The Clover

- The original 3 leaf Clover stood for Hands, Heart, and Head.
- Hustle was almost the 4<sup>th</sup> H but it became Health instead







- 1924- After WWI started, 4-H became more organized and patented the 4-H name and emblem
- 1927- State 4-H Leaders adopted the 4-H Pledge and Motto



#### What is the 4-H motto?

- United we stand
- Live life with a green thumb
- Be kind to others
- To make the best better



#### And then...

- During WWII 4-H worked to help war efforts to produce more food and to collect essentials for war time efforts.
- Asia, Europe, and Latin America all established similar 4-H youth organizations.
- 1959-National 4-H Center opens in Chevy Chase, Maryland.
- 1973 "And my world" was added to the 4-H Pledge.
