University Residences honored by PURA

University Residences recently won the 2008 Arthur G. Hansen Recognition Award for its relationship with its retirees.

The award, sponsored by the Purdue University Retirees Association and the Office of the President, was presented June 4 at the University's annual retirement banquet in Purdue Memorial Union.

University Residences received a trophy to be displayed in the department and will be listed on a plaque in the corridor of Purdue Memorial Union. The award also includes \$2,500, funded by TIAA-CREF, that can be used to help strengthen the department's ties to its retirees.

The award is named for former Purdue President Arthur Hansen, Purdue's eighth president, who established the retirees' association in 1976. The award is given annually to a Purdue school, department, office or division that cultivates and maintains meaningful relationships with its retirees.

Some activities that foster the continuing involvement of retirees include inviting them to help with student organizations, encouraging them to assist with alumni contacts, including them in e-mail distributions with general departmental information, and inviting them to attend social events.

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From your Benefits Committee

Here are some updates from the PURA Benefits Committee and chair Martha Chiscon.

- Those of you who carry the PURcare Senior Supplement/Rx Plan have received or will receive a questionnaire from UnitedHealth in regard to your prescription drug coverage. This is a coordination of benefits (COB) survey and it is being sent out in birth-month order. The first of the surveys arrived in June and they will go out to others throughout this year. The instructions are not very clear so here are some tips.
- 1. Using your UnitedHealth prescription drug card (the one with the blue edge), check to see if the information at the top of the survey agrees with the information on your card. If it does, mark YES to Part A and go to Part B. If NO, put in the correct information.
- 2. Part B refers to prescription drug coverage and generally will be answered

NO unless you are employed somewhere. If NO, go to Part C.

- 3. Part C asks for other coverage beside prescription coverage through PURcare as well as your medical supplement through PacifiCare. For PacifiCare, you are the policy holder so check the medical space. The effective date is Jan. 1, 2008. If you have other prescription drug coverage outside PURcare, list it here and mark the appropriate box. The private insurance name for your medical coverage is PacifiCare and you would check Medigap. If you have any other supplement coverage, you would list it and the carrier. If you have any other prescription drug coverage, you would list it here also.
- 4. Part D asks about liability coverage in regard to prescription drug coverage. Unless you have one of the illnesses listed, most of you will mark NO for this part.
- 5. Sign, date and return the survey in the provided envelope.

- 6. If you are a PURcare member without UnitedHealth prescription coverage and with veteran prescription drug benefits, you are likely to receive a similar survey from your veteran benefits provider.
- Watch for your fall PURA Newsletter and information about PURcare 2009 coverage.
- Representatives from UnitedHealth will be on Purdue's campus on Sept. 9-10. If you have coverage issues you wish to discuss with the representatives, call Michele Salla for an appointment at 765-494-1779. Be sure to bring copies of any Explanation of Benefits (EOB) or medical bills you wish to discuss in case the representative wants to take those with them for review.

If you live outside the Purdue area and need help resolving a PURcare medical or prescription issue, call Kate LaMar at 765-494-1694.

the University," says Scott Rumble, PURA president. "We encourage departments to value the many contributions retirees make."

University Residences was nominated by retired staff members Lanny Wilson and Marilyn Yoder.

They wrote: "After retiring from Purdue, one of the things we missed was the long-time friendships that had been established over the years with colleagues, including those who had retired."

Although University Residences always included retirees in newsletter mailings to keep them updated on campus happenings, there was still a void, the nominators said.

A meeting in the fall of 2006 helped change that. A committee was formed to include four current University Residences staff members and three retirees. That committee was charged with developing a plan for reconnecting with retirees.

The first event was a lunch in June 2007 in Hillenbrand Hall to which all UR retirees were invited. More than 40, plus their guests, attended the event. Another lunch was held in October 2007 at Ford Dining Court.

At both events, retirees were able to connect with old friends and colleagues as well as learn about the current events in University Residences.

UR also invites retirees to holiday parties, retirement receptions, open houses, and tours of new and renovated facilities.

"It is always fun to get to see former co-workers and retirees to re-establish those fond bonds that once existed," Wilson and Yoder wrote. "All in attendance have a wonderful time."

Join fellow retirees for Indiana adventures

The trips offered by the Trips and Tours Committee for fall 2008 will feature a repetition of the popular overnight trip to the French Lick-West Baden resort area, and the opportunity to view the Court Arts of the Chinese Ming Dynasty (1368-1644).

The quality of these offerings is exceptionally high, says Truman Martin, committee chair.

"We certainly hope that we will have a large number of our friends and colleagues join us to enjoy each other's company and interesting travels in Indiana," he says.

PURA trips are open to Purdue retirees, their families and friends. All trips leave from the north end of the Ross-Ade Stadium parking lot near Cherry Lane. The lot is permit parking so retirees should remember to display valid Purdue parking permits.

Details about these trips and registration follow. This will be the only notification so be sure to note the times and dates of departure.

FRENCH LICK AND WEST BADEN. 8 a.m. Sept. 23 to 9 p.m. Sept. 24. Reservation deadline is Aug. 22.

The Southern Indiana resorts offer luxurious guest rooms, gaming in the casino, relaxing in the spa, three golf courses, and one of the world's largest interior domes. Guests will spend the night Sept. 23 in the French Lick Springs Hotel. The trip cost is \$180 per person for those sharing a room or \$240 for those having a single room. The cost includes bus transportation, hotel room, Tuesday dinner and Wednesday breakfast in the Grand Collonnade Café, and a \$10 gaming pass. Participants will be responsible for lunch both days and any golf, spa, mineral bath or casino participation above the \$10 pass.

To help with room assignments and accounting, each person must complete a registration form. Those who want to share a room should find their own roommate.

INDIANAPOLIS MUSEUM OF ART. 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 28. Reservation deadline is Oct. 14.

A very special exhibition is being organized by the Asian Arts Museum

of San Francisco in association with the Palace Museum in Beijing, the Nanjing Museum and the Shanghai Museum. It is titled "Power and Glory: Court Arts of the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644)." It is the first exhibition to focus solely on the Ming Dynasty. Some objects are newly excavated and have never been shown outside of China. The exhibit includes more than 200 objects of gold and jade, textiles, jewelry,

carvings, lacquer pieces, porcelain and metal work.

It will open in San Francisco and travel to Indianapolis and one other location before returning to China. The cost is \$45 per person, which covers transportation and admission to the exhibition. Lunch is not included in the price, but may be purchased at either the Museum Café or Puck's Restaurant.

'Purposeful Living' conference a hit for retirees, exhibitors

The "Purposeful Living in Retirement" seminar, hosted by an ad hoc committee of the Purdue University Retirees Association, was held April 23 at the University Plaza Hotel.

The goal of the conference, said Lowell Landrum, committee chair, was to have speakers who could discuss opportunities for retirees to become involved during their retired life. There also were exhibitors with displays about their services and products. Retirees were given ample time to visit and gain knowledge of those services.

The evaluations for both the exhibitors and attendees indicate that the conference was very successful, Landrum said.

The speakers made various presentations, including about recording family history to pass on to future generations, arts and crafts retirees could look into, personality and how it affects longevity, and things the retirees could place in their "bucket list."

WALLA to offer usual variety of classes during fall session

Campus/area activities set for fall

The Campus and Community Activites Committee has two events planned for fall 2008. Please register with the form at right and mark your calendars.

Tuesday, Sept. 9. 3-4:30 p.m. Purdue Agronomy Farm.

Tour the Agronomy Farm located seven miles northwest of campus on Highway 52. The farm is utilized by 53 researchers from eight departments conducting 180 research projects. The research ranges from basic to applied and includes plant breeding and genetics, crop production and soil tillage management, plant physiology, soil fertility, weed control, disease and insect resistance and control, and variety performance evaluation for corn, soybeans, small grains, sorghum and alfalfa. We also will tour the Beck Agriculture Center, a new 20,000-squarefoot facility which can used to provide educational opportunities for all ages. Please wear comfortable shoes.

Wednesday, Oct. 15. 12:30 - 3 p.m. Caterpillar's Large Engine Center.

Purdue retirees have the opportunity to tour Caterpillar's Large Engine Center. After a brief orientation, there will be a walking tour of the assembly and test area for three families of Caterpillar engines, including the new high-tech C175 Series. The walk is one to one-and-a-half miles and should take up to one-and-a-half hours.

Please wear comfortable closed-toe walking shoes. No photographs may be taken within the plant.

Parking for visitors is at the Visitors Center, the building with the green roof, located next to the plant on Indiana 26.

A third activity planned for the fall is a Women's Basketball Game outing. Details will be announced in the fall newsletter.
