Since 1986, the University of Michigan Summer Enrichment Program (UM SEP) in Health Management and Policy has attracted undergraduate students who seek to improve the health status and health care of underserved communities across the United States. UM SEP partners with Michigan hospitals and other health care organizations in Detroit and Ann Arbor to provide a paid eight week summer internship and to expose students to the health care field and health issues that persist today.

Summer Enrichment Program Components

- Paid 8-week internship at a hospital, community health center or other health care organization in Detroit, Ann Arbor, or other sites in Southeast Michigan
- Orientation at the UM School of Public Health with a lecture series on health inequalities and the US health care system by SPH faculty
- Housing, transportation, food allowance, and GRE preparation course provided, all at no cost
- Weekly meetings and site visits to area health organizations

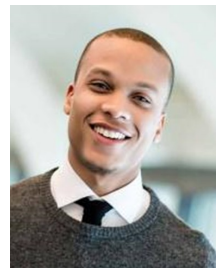
