
Smart Plan

Smart Plan is designed to help you map out when you'll take courses across future semesters. You can also make changes to suggested selectives and electives to customize your academic path.

Here are some other key points to Smart Plan:

- Build a semester-by-semester plan
- Use drag-and-drop scheduling based on prerequisites and course offerings
- Share and review your plan with your advisor
- Think through "How can I get to graduation in the timeframe that I want?"
- Run "What-If" plans to add minors/certificates, double major, or even change your major completely.
- See a clear, visual layout of your time to degree

Smart Plan is best for planning out future terms and talking with your advisor about the order and timing of courses. It's especially helpful when exploring "what-if" scenarios and visualizing how different choices impact your overall plan.



myPurduePlan

Think of **myPurduePlan** as Purdue's official degree audit system—the place to confirm exactly what degree requirements you've completed and what still remains.

Use **myPurduePlan** to

- Confirm which degree requirements are satisfied
- Check remaining credits or courses
- View your GPA, catalog year, major/minor requirements
- Verify that you're on track for graduation clearance

myPurduePlan is best for tracking your progress toward degree requirements and making sure you're on pace to graduate.
