## Class A: 5115 Installing and Configuring the Windows Vista™ Operating System

Overview: This course provides students with the knowledge and skills to install and configure Windows Vista desktops. It will focus on four main areas: installing, securing, networking, and browsing. By the end of the course, the student will have installed and configured a Windows Vista desktop that is secure, on the network, and ready for browsing. This is the first course in the Windows Vista curriculum and will serve as the entry point for other Windows Vista Technology Specialist courses.

Students will focus on six main areas: maintenance and optimization tools, media applications, productivity applications, notebook computers, mobile devices, and Tablet PCs.

The course will focus on five main troubleshooting areas: operating system, hardware, networking, security, and applications. ### Class B: 5119 Supporting Windows Vista Computers with Desktop Images and Application Packages

Overview: This course provides students with the knowledge and skills to use a Windows Vista operating system image and application package deployment infrastructure to minimize the downtime at the Windows Vista client. Desktop support technicians can use this infrastructure to improve the support experience in the following scenarios: new installations, single computer migrations, and single computer reinstallations. The course also provides guidance on how to install application packages on Windows Vista computers for support scenarios that require application updates or reinstalls.
