A Provost's Workshop to Engage the Campus in Internationalization

Purdue's Internationalization Task Force will hold a workshop, "Global Purdue - A Journey to Discovery and Innovation," this Friday, March 6, to examine new and innovative methods for “launching tomorrow’s leaders,” creating “discovery with delivery,” and “meeting global challenges.”

While campus input was summarized for the creation of the strategic plan, the Task Force now seeks faculty, staff, and student ideas and recommendations for implementing the international aspects of the strategic plan, and in doing so, re-creating Purdue as Global Purdue, a global institution in a global society. The Task Force invites all faculty, staff, and students to participate and share in this effort.

Workshop Goals:

1. To initiate discussion and showcase examples of international activities which support the globalization of Purdue and which reflect strategic plan goals.
2. Have faculty and staff share their current international initiatives.
3. Solicit input and ideas from faculty, staff, and students for implementation of international strategic plan goals.

Workshop Outcome: Incorporation of these ideas into the work of the Task Force with strategic planning, creating new international programs, faculty and staff development, international research and engagement facilitation, and curricular design for all academic majors.

Who should be involved: Faculty and staff with international learning, discovery, or engagement portfolios or those who wish to develop these; staff with responsibilities for student advising, student success, or career counseling; and students and others with international interests.
